A church, a public hall, and a school-room attached, intended to be a memorial of the abolition of slavery in America, and of the public services of the late President Lincoln, are no being erected in London.

A marriage between the Princess Louisa of Sweden, only daughter of Charles XV, and the Crown Prince of Denmark, is arranged on the part of the two royal families, but the final decision is to be left to the Prince and Princess themselves.

Two enterprising shoeblacks, locating beneath one of the portals of the Ludgate Hill Railway Station, London, have made their art a luxury to those whose pedal envelopes they operate upon. They seat their patient in a comfortable arm-chair, hand him the day's newspaper, place his feet upon two elevated blocks, and each devoting his energy to one boot, brushes away with a vigor that seems to imply that he means to 'oushine' his companion. The charge for all this, civility included, is one penny.

GREAT FIRE at LEVIS.—Quebec, Aug. 13. About 8:30 last night a fire broke out in the stable near the Grand Trunk Railway Station, Levis, and spread rapidly westward, destroying 15 houses, 700 barrels petroleum, a large portion of Debell's new wharf and lumber thereon, and several hundred feet of railroad track. The Victoria Hotel was destroyed. Loss and insurance not ascertained. Two fire engines were sent over from Quebec, but the tide being low were not of much service.

FIRE.—The Belleville Intelligencer says:—On Sunday morning, about one o'clock, a fire occurred in a stone stable in a rear of Graham's Hotel, Front Street. It had evidently been burning some time, when discovered, for it was found impossible to get anything out of the premises. Four horses belonging to Graham & O'Brien perished in the flames. Several new sets of harness were also burned. The engines were on the ground, and the fire was soon got under. It is not known how the fire originated, but it is strongly suspected that it was the work of an incendiary.

A SWEEPING ROBBERY.—The robbery of a fashionable Presbyterian Church in Philadelphia, on Tuesday last, was committed in such an open manner that no suspicion of the illicit transaction going on "was ever dreamed of." A man, in a cog, opened the church-door at the usual hour of meeting—though there was to be none that evening—hit the church in its usual brilliant style, and sexton-like, commenced to sweep about the coars, and to cause a dust—which those indispensable functionaries know so well how to create. After going through this preliminary operation, he commenced to take up the carpets in the aisles, shake them out, roll them up, and stow them into a truck; one by one were in succession handled, until this unknown genius had rolled about one hundred yards of the carpeting up, and stowed it nicely away in his vehicle. Then putting out the lights and closing the doors in a cool and deliberate manner, left and has not since been heard of. All the time while he was tugging at the carpets, policemen and citizens were passing and re-passing the door; but knowing, as it had been publicly announced, that the church was to be renovated, they concluded that this was the ordinary process and they took no further notice of it.

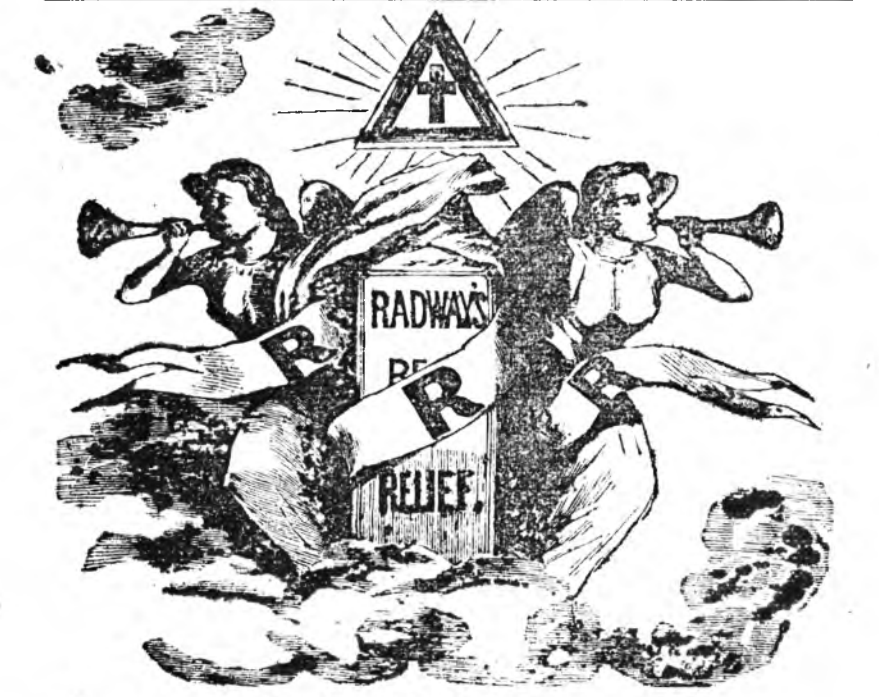
