TRACTION ENGINES .- We are gled to learn that locomotive traction engines, which have been found to work so well in England, and have been so generally adopted the e in localities where railway commu-nication is wanting, are likely soon to come into general use in Canada. Messrs. Richand Garret & Sous, of Leiston Works, Suf folk, well known to be amongst the most machinery in England, convinced of the suitableness of their traction engines to supply the wants of this country, have determined upon establishing an agency here, and have appointed Mr. W. Sutherland Taylor, of this city, to represent them in this country. Mr. Taylor informs us that Messis. Garrett & Sons in order to give the people of Canada an opportunity of witness-ing an engine at work, and of examining one for themselves, intend forthwith to despatch to him for sale one of their best eight horse power engines. We may, therefore, ere long, look for a sight of one of these wonders of mechanical skill in our streets. Messrs. Gooderham & Worts, or this city, are also, we understand, getting out a traction engine for use at their mills, and they will, we hope, give the citizens an opportunity of witnessing it at work here. For the benefit of the uninitiated, we may state that it is a locomotive driven by steam, capable of run-ning at a speed of from three to four miles an hour over common rough roads and up steep inclines. The manufacturers of these engines state that the cost of moving freight by them is one penny half-penny sterling per ton per mile, or less than three cents, so that, at that rate, it would only cost  $4\frac{1}{2}$  cents to move a bushel of wheat 50 miles. The largest of these engines will drag on our common roads from 25 to 30 tons gross weight, and will readily ascend hills of from one in twelve to one in ten. With a less load they will ascend far steeper hills. They weigh about fourteen tons and carry their cwn fuel, and water for a distance of hits inmates. The rooms are spacious and from seven to ten miles. Smaller engines weigh in proportion and of course carry less loads. With the engines are supplied strong and powerful waggons, which carry, without risk, seven tons each. Mr. Worts, the President of the Board of Trade, saw these engines at work when in England, and speaks in high terms of their efficiency and the ease with which they are worked Through crowded streets with heavy loads attached, they moved along as easily and hoiselessly as an ordinary waggon. We have no doubt they will come largely into use in Canada, and supply a want long felt in the back country, viz., cheap transit for heavy goods at a slow pace. They will also be found very serviceable as feeders to our railways and steamers.— Globe.


