CRIME OF RAPE.—A charge of 'fraudulently withholding a statement of accounts' was heard before the police Magistrate yesterday afternoon. The prosecutor being a man named John E. Graham, of White Church, and the defendant, Mr. Moore, of the firm of Moore & Stiles, Auctioneers. It appears from the evidence of the prosecutor that a contract was made by him with Moore for the delivery of his year's crops of grain to the latter, at different times, and in pursuance of such, he had to the value of \$170 were delivered, the quantity on each occasion being acknowledged on a statement in possession which had been paid for by Moore on a d.r. of Mr. Delaportie, of this city for the balance. The order was present, but not paid, when Graham, meeting Moore in the city immediately afterwards, demanded the money. Moore asked Graham to accompany him to the bank. When on his way the latter drew a sum of money and afterward left Graham for the Abou hotel. There Moore asked Graham for the statement, which being obtained he handed back \$30, saying, that was all he should receive. On the statement being demanded back it was refused to be delivered up, and the charge was brought in consequence.—Globe of the 31st.
