The national Credit of France is much inferior to that of Great Britain. The last half century has made a wonderful change in the relative position of the two countries, so far as regards financial affairs. Fifty years ago the annual cost of the British national debt was nearly forty shillings per head for every man, woman, and child in the United Kingdom. At present, partly owing to the reduction of interest, but much more to the increase of population, the annual cost of the national debt is only about seventeen shillings per head. In France, on the other hand, the burden of the national debt is now at least 300 per cent. greater than it was in 1815. Even in spite of the £40,000,000 of hard cash in the coffers of the Bank of France, the French Three per Cent, are only about 68, while the British are 94.
