HIS EXCELLENCY'S SPEECH.

From the Toronto Dailies.

At two o'clock on Saturday afernoon, th Legislature of Ontario was formally opene by the speech from the Throne. Outside th House, there were pretty much the same de monstrations as on the previous day Crowds of persons througed the space i front of the building and cheered heartil on the arrival and departure of Lieut-Gov ornor Stlsted. Cannon thundered the vice regal salute, and at the entrance of the Legislative Chamber were the usual guard of honor and military bands.

Gentlemen of the Legislative Assembly :-In accordance with the provisions of Statute of the Imperial Parliament for th Federal Union of the British North Amer. can Provinces, and for the erection of sepa rate Local Governments in the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec, I have been deputed in the name of Her Majesty the Queen, to open the first session of the Legislature of Ontario. I rejoice at the opportunity whic has been thus afforded me, of welcoming the representatives of the people in this cit so long known as the capital of Upper C nada

This day is the commencement of a ne and important era in our political annal We are met together under the author ty of the British Crown, to enter upon more extended application than we hav hitherto enjoyed of the principle of loca self government. For years past it ha been the aim and effort of Upper Canada to secure a more direct and unfimited contro over her own local affairs, than was attainable whilst in legislative alliance with an- we are in a position to form an opinion other Province, Sensible of the many advantages which have accrued to both sections from this Union, since its accomplish-ment in the year 1841, the people of Western Canada, have, nevertheless desired a wider and more elastic governmental system, which, while it should strengthen and consolidate British Dominion on this continent, should also afford larger opportunities for their own particular growth and expansion. This object we have now obtained through the beneficent interposition of and the enactment of a liberal Homestead the mother country.


