In the sixteenth century, pestilence, slavery, and the cruelty of the Spaniards, succeeded in totally exterminating them. They are described as having been gigantic in stature, but of a singularly mild and gentle nature. Their food consisted of barley, wheat, and goat's milk, and their agriculture was of the rudest kind. They had a religion which taught them of of a future state, of rewards and punishments after death, and of good and evil spirits. They regarded the volcano of Teneriffe as the place of punishment for the bad. The bodies of their dead were carefully embalmed, and deposited in catcombs, which still continue to be an oblect of curiosity to those who visit the islands. Their marriage rites were very solemn; and before engagnment of the control of the con ing in them, the brides were fattened on milk. At the present day, these strange people are totally extinct.

Viper Woman.—The subjoined extract is from the vestry book of the parish of Nelsea, Somerset:—"1762. At a Vestry Meeting held ye 14th day of Japuary, it is agreed that the Viper woman do make a trial on John Lovell, at a Guinea per week." There is evidence, from another entry in the overseers' accounts, that John Lovell was a pauper. Twenty-eight years before the date of the entry in the Nailsea register. 


