By-Law, No. 209:

Whereas it is expedient to pass a By-law to establish a Road crossing the North-East angle of Lot Number Ten in the eighth con-cession as a Public Highway, in the Town-ship of Vaughan, and to provide for the paying of said road. And whereas public notice has been given, as required by Statute 29 and 30, Vict. Chap. 51, Sec. 323 of the intention of the Council, to pass a By Law for establishing the said Road,

Be it therefore exacted by the Municipa Corporation of the Township of Vaughau, and it is hereby enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the road hereinafter described be and the same is hereby established as a public Highway of the width of sixty and two thirds links for the distance of fourteen chains and sixty three links from the northerly boundary of said Lot Number Ten, and then of the width of sixty six and twothirds links, for the distance of six chains and sixty-five links to the front of said Lot, and its centre line to have the following magnetic courses and distances. Commence ing at the distance of eighty-nine chains and seven links from the north west angle of Lot Number Ten in the eighth concession of said Township, thence south fifty nine degrees four minutes, east one chain ninety-eight links, thence south fifty-two degrees forty four minutes, east one chain forty-two links; thence south fifteen degrees fifty-two minutes, east seven chains forty-seven links; thence south thirty five degrees nine minutes, forty eight degrees thirty-five minutes, east one chain ninety-six links; thence south sixty degrees forty-seven minutes, east one than the base of the control of the links of the control of the links east one chain eighty links; thence south concession, and the whole of the land form-
