The undersigned is instructed by the Government of Canada to inform intending Contractors that an early day tenders will be invited for the execution of certain portions of the Intercolonial Railway between River De Loup and Rimo ski, in the Province of Quebec; between Truro and Anbster, in the Province of Nova Scotia; and between Dalhousie and Halifax, in the Province of New Brunswick.
