ODDS AND ENDS

THE death of Lord Wynford is annonced. A ROYAL decree abolishes slavery in all the Portuguese possessions.

EXCELLENT SPONGE CARE.—Whites of twelve eggs, yelks of ten eggs, one pound of sugar, three-quarters of a pound of flour, Flavor with lamon. Stir the flour in lightly Boston Cake. - One pound of sugar, and

half a pound of butter stirred together, three eggs heat lightly, one glass of wine, half a pint of milk, mixed with the wine, and an even tea-spoonful of soda sifted with a pound of flour: bake in a rather quick oven. To ROAST A DECK .- Prepare it for the

spit in the same way as a goose. Stuff with sage, onion, thyme, bread crumb, and butter, and baste them well with salt and water and their own gravy. It will require an hour to cook. Serve with current jelly or apple-sauce.

THE mail from South Australia brings dates to the 5th of January. The harvest had nearly been completed. The average yield was 12 bushels to the acre, which, giving a total of 6,000,000 bushels, prices had further declined, and wheat was now 4s. per bushel, and flour £12 per ton.

POTATO POPE.—This is a favorite dish in the West Indian Islands. Wash, peel and grate two pounds of potatoes; add four ounces each of sugar and butter (or beef dripping.) melted, one tea-spoonful each of salt and pepper; mix well together; place it in a baking dish, and put it into a brisk oven until it is done and becomes nicely browned.

THE Queen has become a patroness of the Society for Promoting the Employment of Women, and a subscriber to its funds The Crown Princess of Prussia and the Princess Louise have also become patronesses of the society, and have sent donations to its funds. The Crown Princess has long bestowed much support and encouragement on a society with similar objects in Berlin.

ADVICE TO SMOKERS .- Avoid smoking on an empty stomach, unless you have one of those organisms which are eminently insensible; for not only does the absorption of Nicotine under such conditions take place more rapidly, whence the injurious accumulation results, but inasmuch as in most cases the sa ivary secretion is stimulated, this brings with it a stimulation of the gastrie glands, and gastric juice is poured into the empty stomach, producing a feeling of nausea and constriction. Smoke slowly: the enjoyment is prolonged, and the danger of accumulation is lessened. Let your tobacco be dry. Nicotine is volatile at the temperature of combustion, and the greater part contained in a cigar evaporates in the air; but Nicotine is very soluble in water, and what is thus dissolved instead of evaporating enters the system. The practice of wetting the cigar all over before lighting it should therefore be avoided. Those who are susceptible should be careful in the choice of tobacco, the different kinds of which have widely different amounts of Nicotine. In that of Turkey, Greece, and Hungary there is scarcely a trace of the poison. In that of Brazil, Havanna, and Paraguay the amount is 2 per cent. In that of Maryland, 2.29; of Alsace, 3.21; of Kentucky, 5; of Virginia, 6.87; and of France, 7.30 per cent.
