FEEDING SWEDISH TURNIPS TO MILCH Cows.-The feeding of turnips to cows in winter, when pasturage is gone, has a tendency to add largely to the flow of milk. The use of them is disliked however, by dairymen, on account of the strong and disagreeable turnipy flavor they impart, both to the milk and butter. A remedy for the evi was discovered some years since by Rev. A. Huxtable, of England. This remedy is important, and as many of our readers may have never seen it in print, we insert the recipe which is as follows :- "Dissolve half an ounce of chloride of lime in one gallon of water, and add a tablespoonful of this to each gallon of milk. Frequently, if the turnips are very strong, three times as much will be required; but this will depend upon

the dairywomau's taste." PAPER did not come in to use till the 13 century. The first machine for the production of paper was constructed in 1260, at Ravensburg, and paper was first manufac-tured in Italy, in 1335, in France, in 1560, in Switzerland in 1470, in England in 1588. in Holland in 1685, in Russia in 1712, and in Pennsylvania in 1725. The number of paper mills now existing in the principal States of Europe is as follows: Great Britain, 408; France, 276; Germany, 243; Anstria, 78; Russia, 40; Italy, 30; Belgium, 26; Spain, 17; Switzerland, 13; Sweden, 8; Turkey, 1. In the United States there are 430 paper mills. The annual production of paper in Europe is 8,966,000 cwt., valued at £15,000,000. The improved paper mills, working continuously for a whole year, would menufacture 62,560.000 sheets, which, if laid side by side, would extend over a length equal to that of the dia-

meter of the earth.


