THURSDAY, Feb. 3.—The Council resumed this morning at ten o'clock, the Warden in the chair.

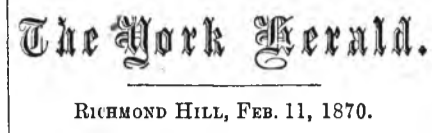
