A REMARKABLE CAVERN. - As two quarrymen were working in the Kitcraft quarry, on the Portland Heights, they had occasion to remove some stone from the "basebed," and at fifty-six feet below the surface they came upon a fissure in the rock. On exploring it about one hundred yards they found an opening on each side of thirty yards. Proceeding four hundred yards further, there was an opening to the upper surface, through which the light is admitted. The cavern then extends at least one hundred yards further, and is altogether six hundred yards in length. From the roof depend beautiful stalactites, many of them two feet and three feet long, and of different tints, some amber and others cream colour. Some curious petrifactions have also been found of fantastic shapes. The quarrymen are foolishly breaking off the stalactics and selling them for a trifle.
