FACTS WORTH KNOWING .- The whole number of languages spoken in the world amount to 2,523, viz., 587 in Europe, 395 in Asia, 276 in Africa, aud 1,264 in America. The inhabitants of the globe profess more than 1,000 different religions. The number of men is about equal to the number of woman. The average of human life is about 33 years. One-quarter die previous to the age of seven years, one-half before reaching 17. Of every 1,000 persons, one reaches 100 years of life of every 100 only six reach the age of 65, and not more than one in 500 lives to 80 years of age. There are on the earth 1,000, 000,000 inhabitants. Of the, 33,333,333 die every year, 3,800 every hour, and 60 every minute, or one every second. These losses are about balanced by an equal number of births. The married are longer lived than the single; and above all, those who observe a sober, industrious conduct.
