NEW PATENT TILTING TABLE

FOR PICKING UP LODGED GRAIN. This is the only valuable Tilling Table offered on any combined Reaper and Mower. The Table can be very easily raised or lowered by the Driver in his seat without stopping his Team. This is one of the most important improvements effected in any Machine during the past two years.

ANY ONE OR ALL OF THE ARMS OF THE Reel can be made to act as Rakes at the option of the Driver, by a Lever readily operated by his foot. The cutting apparatus is in front of the Machine, and therefore whether Reaping or Mowing the entire work of the machine is under the eye of the Driver while guiding his team.

The Table is so constructed as to gather the Grain into a Bundle before it leaves the Table, and deposit it in a more compact form than any other Reel Rake.

The Table is attached to the Machine both in front and rear of the Driving Wheel, which enables it to pass over rough ground with much greater ease and less injury to the Table. The Grain Wheel Axle is on an axle with the axle of the drive wheel, which enables it to turn the corners readily.

The Rakes are driven by Gearing instead of Chains, and therefore have a steady uniform motion.

Making them much less liable to breakage on uneven ground, and more regular in removing the grain. The Gearing is very simple, strong and durable. The boxes are all lined with

BABBIT METAL. THE PARTS ARE ALL NUMBERED, so that repairs can be ordered by telegraph or otherwise, by simply giving the number of the part wanted.
