COAL.-The quantity of coal raised in the United Kingdom for the year 1870, amounted to 110,431,192 ton, the estimated value of which was £27,607,798, whereas all the March 27, 1872. of the United Kingdom produced 103,141, UST OPENED! 231.192 tona. The bulk of this enormous production was raised in England, and, as near as may be, one fourth of the whole in the counties of Durham and Northumberland. In fact, these two counties produced about one million tons more coal in 1870 than was produced in North and South Wales, Scotland, and Ireland. The production of Scotland in the year named amounted to 14,934,553 tons, while Ireland followed far behind with 141,470 tons.
