The Pestmaster General's Report.

We learn from the Hon. Mr. Campbell's report for 1871 that the number of Post Offices in the Dominion then was 3,943, of which 565 were in New Brunswick, 742 in Nova Scotia, and the remainder in Ontario and Onehee. The number of letters and postal cards transmitted was 27,050,000; of newspapers, 22,250,000; of registered letters, 1.100.00; of free letters, 1,218,400; and of parcels, 64,160.

The Department is now nearly self sustain-

ing. The total expenditure for the year was \$1,271,007, while the revenue was only \$1,079,767. The deficiency is mainly caused by the large excess of expenditure in Nova Scotia and New Brunswick. In the two larger Provinces the mail service accounts come more nearly to balancing each other. The number of money order offices open in the Dominion was 571, at which orders were issued to the number of

111.530, and for the amount of \$4,537,902.
