DIFFERENT LINKS OF LIFE.—We are oftentimes in suspense between the choice of different pursuits. We chose one at last doubtless, and with an unconquered hankering after the other. It is not improbable that we had been unhappy, but extremely probable that we had not been less so had we made a different decision.

ASSAULT AND ROBBERY.—It is very much to be feared that the immunity with which a person could, at one period of our history, walk the streets of Toronto at any time of the night without fear of being either assaulted or robbed, must be reckoned among the things of the past. We have been constantly hearing, of late, of men and defiant acts of rowdism committed on some of our most public thoroughfares, which is truly alarming, and proves one of two things, that our police force is inefficient or not sufficiently strong in number to come with the increase of rowdism in our midst.

It was only yesterday that we learned, that on Thursday night, about midnight, one of the boldest and most determined attempts at robbery, and in fact murder also, took place in the very heart of the city. It appears that as Mr. Robert Griffith, of this city, was proceeding in Church Street on his way home, he was attacked by three fellows who attempted to rob him. Mr. Griffith had not long been arrived by the late train on the Grand Trunk West, from Berlin, and when he had reached the east side of Church St., near the Music Hall, he was surprised by three fellows who were standing on the other side of the street.

They walked across to where Mr. Griffith was, and after they had followed him a short distance he resisted a violent blow on the head, from behind, with a sharp instrument—a small crooked probe—which threw Mr. Griffith down. When he was about to regain his feet he was kicked in the mouth by one of the ruffians, and his satchel, which he had with him, picked up and made off with into Stanley Street, by another of the men.

Two of the villains remained, if possible, rifled his pockets, but in this failed. A younger Griffith, who is a powerful fellow, manhood, although semi-conscious, drove them from him. The most extraordinary thing of the whole of this proceeding is that there should have been such an entire absence of policemen at this most dangerous part of the city. Mr. Griffith, it seems, shouted loudly for "Police," but they were now out.
