This morning his physici ans held a consultation, and decided to perform another operation upon him at noon to day. At the time the consultation was held, his pulse was strong and regular, at 84 beats per minute. At 10.25 a.m. signs that he was sinking appeared. The action of the heart suddenly failed, and he died at 10:45 o'elock."

The above is signed by Sir Henry Thompson M. Conneau, M. Corvisart, and M. Clover.

LONDON, Jan. 9, evening.—The sudden death of the ex Emperor Napoleon took everybody at Chiselhurst, as well as in Lon don, by surprise. The Empress, his relatives, attendants of the household, and even his physicians were unprepared for it. The Emperor had passed a comparatively com fortable night. His strength seemed undiminished, and at the consultation early in the morning it was thought he could bear a third operation, which was fully determined npon. So great was the confidence felt in the patient's condition that the Prince Imperial was permitted to return to Woolwich to resume his studies. Dr. Gull went to London yesterday, and many of the Emper or's personal friends, who hastened to Chischurst at the first alarm, had returned to their homes. There was no reason what ever to apprehend a fatal turn in the case up to 9 a.m., when new and dangerous symp toms suddenly set in.
