

Why was the House Dissolved?

A great many may not be aware of the reasons that compelled the Ministry to dissolve the present House, and we propose to give an explanation. Our readers will remember that, at the time of the resignation of Sir John, the charges against him had dwindled down to the only thing of which they could accuse him, that he had used money to carry on the elections of 1872, which he was compelled to do by the Grit record. It will also be remembered that Sir John gave notice that he would, on the assembling of the House, move for a Committee to enquire into the amount of money spent by members at the last general election, and the manner in which it was spent. Mr Blake accepted Sir John's challenge, and afterwards, the hon. member for Ottawa, Sir John Macdonald, who had been elected to the House, moved that three-fifths of them owed their election to a lavish expenditure of money, and that they, themselves, were far guiltier than Sir John. And, as a proof of this, did not Mr Mackenzie himself admit since that he believed both sides used money corruptly. And did not that member of financial ability—John Richard Cartwright, our present Finance Minister—admit that it was money that gained him his seat in 1872? And what, we ask, in the event of a Committee of investigation, would have been the position of that notorious individual—Henry Herman Cook, M. P. (by the way, he is now in the House, having been elected on the 11th inst.) who cost him only \$1,900; and Wilkes, Blin, Edgar, and a host of other Grits to the list of those whose dollars purchased them their titles of M. P. Consequently, in order to steal a march on Sir John, the House was dissolved, and thus the men who condemned Sir John A. Macdonald, because he had authorized the use of money, had themselves to dis. The House, in order to escape the scrutiny of a Committee of investigation; and, to shield themselves and their creatures, they put the country to an expense of over \$100,000. Again, they have been two months endeavoring, by a certain process of incubation, to hatch a policy, and the political clouds dark not surround it to the past House, not to the people. They are now hoping that by this election they will secure a majority of cringing Grits like Cook, who would follow them, even to the overthrow of the Dominion.

Election of Simcoe show your abhorrence of the men who shrank to stand the test of the ordeal which they denounced one of Canada's best men for a deed of which they are more guilty than he. We once had a Cabinet of men—it is now composed of arrant cowards.

There was a severe snow storm in Salt Lake City on Jan. 2nd, and north through Montana.

The Committee on Appropriations of the U. S. House of Representatives has reported in favor of reducing the Army estimates \$6,500,000, and the Navy estimates 2,000,000.

Senor Castelar has addressed to the Spanish people a protest against what he calls "the recent brutal coup d'etat." He declares that his conscience will not permit him to associate with demagogues, and that his honor refused to accept a situation created by bayonets.

The Villa de Havre.—The French Admiralty Court, which has had the duty assigned to it by the Government, has rendered a verdict to the following effect:—The conduct of the captain and crew of the steamer was irreproachable. The collision was wholly due to the Loch Earn, manoeuvred contrary to every rule of the international maritime code. The said Capt. Simeon will be appointed to command the French trans Atlantic steamer Ville de Paris.

The more prominent lumbermen in the western portion of the United States are now moving to secure a convention of men who are in the lumber interest, in order to prepare measures for the protection and preservation of the lumber forests of the North West. It is stated, on what lumbermen deem reliable authority, that the total pine resources of the North West are 248,400,000 feet, and that the pine crop of the Rocky Mountains will be exhausted in five years.

Touching the United States Budget which, it is thought, will show the rather serious deficit of \$5,000,000, while the Treasury fears that the deficit next year may be even greater, and therefore asks for a return to higher taxation, which Congress hesitates to grant, and favors a loan, the London Spectator remarks that "the new taxes would scarcely begin to draw before the crisis will be over," and believes that the slight increase in American credit, which will seriously injure American credit, which, in its slight degree, upon the way in which Congress recently taxed the country, if it wanted to pay off the debt in this generation.



Kingston, Jan. 12.—The interferences of some Government officials is getting beyond bounds. We understand from a reliable source that the Deputy Warden of the Provincial Penitentiary, and the County Assessor and other officers, are spending the time which should be devoted to the public service, in canvassing for Sir John. It is to be hoped that an example will be made of some of these gentlemen who think it right to neglect their duties for the benefit of the cause of dishonesty.

In Louisville, Ky., as well as previously in New York and other large cities, the laboring men, who have been thrown idle by thousands by the continued depression in business and lessened demand for workmen in the usual channels, have petitioned the authorities for work. The present adverse condition for laborers seems to have developed a tendency among the poor in nearly all the States to look to Governmental authority for food and work whenever a scarcity of either is to be feared. This tendency grows, the people here become more like the older people who live under other Government forms.

The gravest fears are still entertained concerning the famine in Bengal. The latest accounts are that no rain had fallen yet; that the situation is unchanged, and that the calamity is likely to be of really tremendous extent. Though what are considered "great efforts" there are being made to irrigate some thousands of acres of rice lands, they cannot be made available in time, and grave fears are expressed concerning the preservation of cattle for the Viceroy says food is already too dear to be given to them. If transportation can be secured, the wheat eating people need not suffer very seriously; but even then the Superintendent Engineer of Orissa believes the loss from the famine will be one-half the population, 25,000,000, and 1-10 in any case.
