Emigration.

The annual return issued by the Marine Department of the Board of Trade of emigration from the United Kingdom, shows that during the year 1873 there were 232,885 emigrants from England, of whom 190,157 went from Liverpool, and 26,682 from London. From Glasgow and Greeneck there went 24516 emigrants; from Cork, 40,314; from Londonderry, 11.311; and from other Irish ports, 1,576. The grand total from the whole of the United Kingdom therefore amounted to 310,612. Of English emigrants, 78,968 went to the United States; 19.438 to British North American colonics; 18,814 to Australian colonies; and 6,123 to other placos. Of Scotch emigrants, 12 226 went to the United States; 5,423 to the North American colonies; 2,852 to Australian colonies; and 809 to other places. Of Irish emigrants, 75,536 went to the United States, whilst only 4,184 went to the North American colonies, 3,471 to Australian colonies, and 501 to other places. No fewer than 72,198 of the emigrants included in the return were foreigners; and of these 61,320 went to the United States, 7,687 to North American colonies, 1,029 to Australian colonies, and 2,162 to other places. 10,069 of emigrants are not distinguished as being of any particular nationality; and of these 5.023 went to the States; 476 to North Ameri-can colonies; 262 to Australian colonies; and 4,308 to other places. Of the total number of 310,612, therefore, 233,073 have gone to the United States; 37,208 to North American colonies; 26,428 to Australian colonies; and 13,903 to other places. The emigration from the United Kingdom in 1873 was the largest that has taken place in one year eince 1854.
