A draft of agreement was presented between the County Council and the Toronto Graver Road and Concrete Company, regulating the conditions of building a Tramway between the Don Bridge and the gravel beds in the township of Scarboro', along the Kingston Road. The consideration was de-

SMAIL-POX PATIENTS. A Special Committee reported on some steps that had been taken to prevent the passing of convalescent small pox patients and the country to the manifest danger of apreading the discusse. The report was received and adopted.

HURON AND OMTARIO CANAL.

A Special Committee, Mr Bull chairman, presented the following report: - Your Committee. on the 1st day of June, met with the Committees from the City of Toronto and the County of Sincoe and the Directors of the Canada Company.

The President of the Canada Co. stated

that one million of dollars of stock had been Taken, and that one hundred thousand had been paid in to the Treasurer of the Co. and deposited in the bank. That responsible entlemen in the States had taken stock to the amount of upwards of twelve millions I he delegates from Toronto felt certain tha the Cuy would grant one million and a half towards the enterprise. The delegates from Simcoe County expressed themselves very ewarmly in favor of building the canal, and astated that the County was prepared to grant wight hundred thousand towards the scheme.

The Committee was not prepared to state at that meeting what the County of York would do towards the building of the canal. as there had been nothing definite before the Council. The Committee was of opinior sthat the Dominion Government should move in the matter, and make a grant of land to wards the construction of the canal. The report was read and adopted by the

No other business was done, and the Coun cil adjourned sine die.

The Liberals were by no means stingy in in their treatment of the other Princes; and the Conservatives, it may reasonably be .x. pected, will not be outdone in whatever nay indicate attachment to the Royal Family. Mr James Gordon Bennett of the N. Y. Herald and the proprietors of the London Daily Telegraph are to fit out an expedition for the exploration of Africa. The enterprise is to be under the control of Mr H.M. Stanley. Certainly the men who have originated this project deserve the applause of mankind. Of Mr Stanley's fitness for the post assigned him there can be no question. All will wish the highest success to the uni dertaking. Whatever discoveries may be made will be in the interests of science and civilization. But what an idea does this attempt give of the influence and power attained by journalism. It is now no longer content with recording the occurrences of the known world; it must remove the veil from regions unknown. At this rate where shall a limit be placed to the functions of the Press ?
