THE ELECTIONS.

Polling day has come and gone, and the results from all the constituencies in Ontario are by no means encouraging to the Grits. Seventy eight seats were contested. Of these, the Government have secured 42, including 2 Independents, which, we are assured, they will not get. The Opposition again have elected all of 36 representatives who may be considered opponents to the Government.

Mr. Lemore came forward and stated to the Council that they could have the use of the Hall known as the Court Room, for Council meetings, and also for meetings of the Fire Brigade for the ensuing year, and that he would supply fire and lamp light every night of meeting, at the charge of twelve dollars for the year.

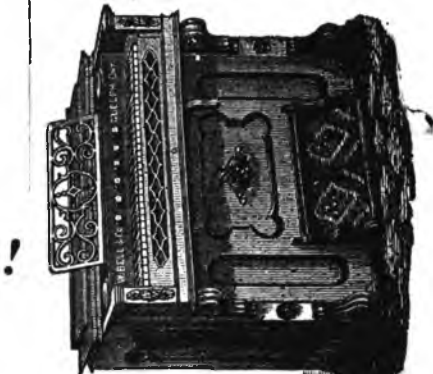
