His standing in the Council may be inferred by his position as Warden, the first Deputy Reeve ever elected to that honorable position, and by the largest Council ever convened in the County. It is, Sir, to my mind, a greater honor to be elected to preside over the representatative men of three Ridings of the County of York, than to represent any one of them in the House of Commons. By example, Mr. Wallace preaches temperance, and altho' I Smith, Nelson, Macdonald & Con not think a pledged tee totaller, yet, in Smith, Nelson, Macdonald & Con reality, a practical one; and is ever-ready to aid in the promoting of temperance, and other Christian and charitable purposes. He also efficiently superintends one of the largest and most flourishing Sabbath Schools in the County.
