

Markham Township Council

The Markham Township Council met at Hall's Hall, Unionville, on Saturday, the 22nd inst. Members were all present. Reeve in the chair. The minutes of last meeting read and confirmed.

PETITION PRESENTED.

By Mr. Kester, from Michael Yake and seven others, asking that Lots 32 and 33, in the 9th con., be struck off the Union School Section of Stouffville and annexed to Section 22, Markham.

COMMUNICATION.

From J W Collins, with information that Messrs. T Loyd and C J Brodie are appointed commissioners to act in conjunction with the Markham Township commissioners, for procuring material and building a bridge on the townline opposite the 5th con.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the sum of \$55 for placing stumps and brush at the German Mill Hill; said amount payable to the order of the commissioners when the contract is completed.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to retain out of the funds of the municipality the sum of \$23 90 for his services as Registrar under 39 Vic., Sec 24, Act of Ontario.

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the Reeve, A Duncan and the mover be a committee to act in conjunction with the commissioners appointed by Whitechurch Council to erect a bridge on townline between the Township of Whitechurch and Markham, in the 5th con., and that the Clerk notify the Whitechurch Council of the same.

Mr. O'Connell, seconded by Mr. Reesor, moved that the account of Speight & Son for 384 feet of Plank furnished to Road Division No. 36, amounting to \$3 84, be paid, and that the Treasurer pay the same.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Reesor, moved that the Treasurer pay Mr. B Fenwick, the sum of \$1 80, for oil cloth for the use of Council table.

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. James, moved that the sum of \$5 be paid to C H Chant, for furnishing a coffin and burying Ann, size, a pauper, and that the Treasurer pay the same.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Williamson, moved that the Treasurer pay Joseph Barkey, the sum of \$1 24, for 15 1/2 loads gravel placed on townline, on condition that the municipality of Whitechurch pay a like amount.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. James, moved that the Treasurer pay the costs in suit &c., Brown vs. Markham [Stouffville Public School] viz: Messrs McDougall & Gordon, \$32 83; Macdonald & Patterson, \$57 86; J Stephenson, travelling expenses and collecting evidence, \$7 35.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the Whole for to audit the Township accounts for the year 1878.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. James, moved that accounts as now audited by the Council be passed, and that the Clerk be instructed to have 200 copies printed for distribution.

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Reesor, moved that the Clerk be authorized to request all pathmasters who have not made their returns already to do so on or before the first day of April next.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the sum of \$3 60 be paid by the Treasurer to the order of Watson Collinson, road overseer Div. No. 9, said sum being for 45 loads of gravel laid on his Division in 1878.

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Reesor, moved that the sum of \$79 68 be paid to Wm Gardner, for work done in building the approaches to the bridge in 2nd con. opposite Lot No. 2, said work being certified to as being correct by Messrs James Reith, John Morgan and H W Harper, and that the Treasurer pay the same.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Kester, moved that the Treasurer be and is hereby instructed to pay the sum of \$170 for building abutments and filling approaches at the Pomona Hill bridge, said amount payable to the commissioners and contractor.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Reesor, moved that the Clerk be empowered and authorized to let the pile driver to private individuals at the rate of \$2 per diem, and that the seal of the corporation be attached to this resolution.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. Williamson, moved that when this Council adjourns, it stands adjourned until Saturday, the 19th day of April next.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. Williamson, moved that Messrs Dutton, Wm Armstrong, N C Reesor and the mover be and are hereby appointed commissioners to build a bridge on the Rouge, between Lots 10 and 11, in the 10th con., better known as Reynolds's bridge.

Mr. Reesor, seconded by Mr. James, moved that the Reeve be and is hereby appointed to examine and have removed if deemed necessary, the driftwood in the Hume between the 7th con. line and Capt Milne's pond.

The Council adjourned.


