

VILLAGE COUNCIL

August 18th, 1879.

Pursuant to adjournment the Council met. The Reeve in the chair. Councilors present, Messrs. McConaghy, Powell, Redditt and Savage. The minutes of meeting of 14th July read and approved.

The clerk read the following accounts: M H Keefer, printing and advertising Voters List etc. \$10 60 C Presbyterian Church Trustees, two graves..... 4 00 John Sanvidge, digging grave 2 00 W Bricknell's account cutting thistles, repairing sidewalks..... 7 75 T J Dobson, for service as Assessor..... 20 00

Moved by Mr Savage, seconded by Mr Powell, that the Treasurer is hereby instructed to pay the foregoing accounts.—Carried.

The petition of H B Dewsbury and twenty-six others, praying the Council to proclaim Tuesday, the 26th of August a "Civic Holiday" was read, and prayer granted.

Mr Redditt moved, seconded by Mr McConaghy that the clerk is hereby instructed to have twenty-five small hand bills printed (by tender) proclaiming Tuesday, the 26th of August, a civic holiday.—Carried.

The clerk read the following communication from K Mackenzie, Esq., Judge of the County Court of York, relating to Mr D C O'Brien's Appeal from the Court of Revision:

Toronto, 18th July, 1879. SIR,—I received yesterday what purports to be a notice of appeals from the Court of Revision of the village of Richmond Hill, to Judge of the County. The notice is all wrong and illegal, and no proceeding can be had upon it. It does not appear in the notice that O'Brien, the appellant, is a Municipal Elector, according to section 56, subsection 3 of the "Assessment Act," or an Agent for any person under subsection 2, and the grounds of appeal are not specially set forth and stated, as required by the Act. There can be no appeal heard on this notice. I have no jurisdiction to act on it.

To the clerk of the village of Richmond Hill. A communication dated Toronto, July 8th, 1879, from H J Hill, Secretary of the Industrial Exhibition Association, together with other printed papers and Prize list, was laid before the Council, and the communication was read; also communications from John Caldwell, dated 25th July, and William Morrison, dated 31st July, relating to Hand Fire Engines.

A communication from James Daniels, dated 18th August, was read, by which Mr Daniels resigns the office of Inspector, etc., and accepted.

Moved by Mr Savage, seconded by Mr McConaghy, that Mr Trench, Mr Redditt and Mr John H Sanderson be a committee to purchase a Hand Fire Engine, Reel and sufficient Hose, for this village, if they can find such to suit, not to exceed seven hundred dollars.—Carried.

Mr Redditt moved, seconded by Mr Savage, that Messrs McConaghy and Powell be a committee to make arrangements with Mr Palmer for renting Council Room, Engine House, and other necessary accommodations required for Municipal purposes, and report at next meeting.—Carried.

Mr Powell moved, seconded by Mr McConaghy, that the committee on streets and sidewalks are hereby authorized to receive tenders for laying plank sidewalks on Arnold street, and Centre street (east) to be three planks wide, and on Church street, and Dufferin street to be two planks wide. Tenders to be left at the clerk's office (seal'd) up to noon on Monday next, the 25th inst.—Carried.

The Council adjourned to meet at 8 p.m. on 25th inst., in Court Room. M. TEEFY, Clerk.

Silver Wedding.

Unionville is becoming justly celebrated for its social qualities, notably in celebrating the anniversaries of weddings. Crosby, Esq., and wife, on the 8th inst., and eclipsed all previous celebrations both in the number of guests and quantity and quality of souvenirs presented. Amongst the most attractive and expensive of these presents were a centre piece, being a fruit corbeil presented by Mr. and Mrs. J. Stephenson; a sugar bowl and spoons presented by Mr. and Mrs. J Webber; a service by thirty-six of the citizens of the ambitious village of Unionville; a silver sewer presented by Messrs. Johnson and Sheffel was also of very unique design.—Economist.
