

Vaughan Township Council.

The Municipal Council of the Township of Vaughan, met at the Town Hall on Wednesday the 17th day of December, 1879, at 10 a. m.

The minutes of last meeting were read, and on motion adopted. The following petitions were presented:

From John Williams, and 11 others, asking aid for Andrew Bedell and wife, indigents.

From James Malloy, and 12 others, asking the Council to pay the funeral expenses of Manassah Thompson's five children.

From William Lansdel, and 12 others, asking aid for James Hall, indigent.

From James Keedwell, and 20 others asking aid for James Abrahams, indigent.

A communication was read from Messrs. Henderson and Snider, to R. Harrison, Osler and Moss.

A Sheep claim, amounting to \$10 was presented by Wm. Mushaw.

Moved by Mr. Reaman, seconded by Mr. Card, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay to the following undermentioned persons the following sums for charitable purposes:

To Wm C Patterson, for two shirts for John Davidson, \$2; John Keys, 14 weeks board and lodgings at Mrs Owens, \$1.50 per week, \$21.00; J M Lawrence, for A Budell and wife, \$4.00; J M Lawrence, for John Graves, special grant \$4; Mr Abrahams, of Wood bridge, lump sum \$5; Wm Patterson, for James Hall, \$6; Mrs J Lund, funeral expenses Thompson's five children, \$30.00; John Langstaff, for Jane Espy \$20.00.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Lahmer, seconded by Mr Nattress, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following road accounts as certified by the Road Commissioners in their respective districts:

sheet Nomination and Election posters.—Carried. Moved by Mr Card, seconded by Mr Reaman, that the Reeve is hereby authorized to put up notices on the 2nd Con, opposite Lot 27, forbidding all parties removing sand off the road allowance.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Nattress, seconded by Mr Card, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following named road commissioners the following sums:

Wm Patterson, 2 dollars and 50 cts; Isaac Murray, 2 dollars and 50 cts; Mrs Walker 5 dollars; Mr Snider, balance, 10 dollars.—Carried.

By Law No. 387 was then passed, appointing Deputy Returning officers for holding the Municipal Elections for 1880, as follows:

The Council then adjourned sine die.

LAW CONCERNING NEWSPAPERS 1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from a post office, whether directed in his name or another's, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for payment.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued he must pay all arrears, or the publishers may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

3. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncollected, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
