The heavy storms at the Azores have caused much damage to shipping.

A large number of Nihilists have recently been arrested in Warsaw.

Famine has appeared in south-eastern Russia, and many people have already perished.

The sudden thaw in Austria is arousing apprehensions of a flood in Vienna and Pesth.

At a Socialist Congress held at Pittsburg it has been decided to nominate a Socialist candidate for the Presidency.

Extensive Customs frauds in the importation of silks, velvets, etc., have been discovered in New York.

Mr Plimsoll is about to inaugurate an agitation for the prevention of loading vessels with grain in bulk.

The Dominion Parliament has been convened for the 12th February, for the despatch of business.

The Duchess of Marlborough's Irish relief fund amounts to \$32,000.

A safe was blown open with nitroglycerine at Omemee on Thursday night, and papers valued at \$25,000 carried off by the burglars.

A farmer of the township of McKillop was burned to death on New Year's Day whilst trying to save a portion of the contents of his burning dwelling.

The Russian Government sending immense quantities of war material by way of Odessa for the proposed expedition to Meiv next spring.

The German Admiralty is considering the advisability of blowing up the sunken ironclad GROSSER KURFURST, all attempts to raise having failed.

The rivers Rhine and Main in Germany are overflowing their banks, owing to the channels being blocked with ice, and several towns are inundated.

General Hatch is in Salt Lake City, whither he has brought a number of Lie chiefs for the purpose of preventing any demonstration by the young men of the tribe.

A very marked improvement has taken place in the business of New York in the year just closed, as indicated by the large decrease in the number of failures and in the amount of liabilities.

Count de St Valier, the French Ambassador to Berlin, is bent on withdrawing from the post. He is dissatisfied with the new French Government, and is anxious to take his seat in the Senate to oppose Ferry's Education Bill.

The new French Premier was most cordially addressed by the German Minister and Papal Nuncio at President Grey's New Year's Day reception to diplomatic representatives. M De Freycinet is a Pro-tenant.

A few days ago it was reported that man named Thomas Mulligan was burnt to death in his shanty in Compton County, Que. It now appears that he was murdered by a neighbor for the trifling sum of money he possessed, and that the body was burnt to hide the crime. The murderer, a man named William Gray, has been arrested and the money of his victim found in his house. His wife is also under arrest as an accomplice.

M de Lesseps has arrived in Panama, and New Year's Day he inaugurated the work of verifying the canal surveys. He adheres to the sea level plan, which he considers the only tenable one, and expects to be able to commence the work of construction in about six months. The Panama people have received De Lesseps with the greatest enthusiasm, and are welcoming him with a three days' holiday, a grand parade, a bull fight, and a banquet.

Anti-Rent in Ireland.

Serious Affray Between the Constabulary and Galway Peasants

TWO HUNDRED EXTRA POLICE DRAFTED—TENANT RIGHT MEETINGS.

LONDON, Jan 5.—A very serious affray occurred on Friday between the loyal Irish Constabulary and some peasants of Galway. The police fired on the people, but nobody was injured. Galway County is in a very disturbed condition, and two hundred extra police have been drafted there.

An anti rent meeting was held in Claremorris, County Galway, on Sunday, at which 3,000 people were present.

A tenant-right meeting was held at Killarney, Ireland, yesterday. 6,000 were present. The usual resolutions favoring a peasant proprietary and condemning the action of the Government were adopted.

The Afghan War.

The Country Quiet and Supplies coming into Cabul.

LONDON, Jan 2.—General Roberts reports under date of December 31 that the country is quiet, and his communications have been restored. Numbers of the people are returning to Cabul, and supplies are coming in.

CABUL, Jan 2.—The Military Commission has reassembled to try the prisoners who have been sentenced to be hanged on the 30th ultimo. One was proved to have killed Jenkins, the Secretary of Major Cavagnari's Embassy.

Parnell's Arrival.

A Hearty Welcome to America.

NEW YORK, Jan 2.—The SCYTHIA arrived in port this morning, having on board Messrs Parnell and Dillon, both of whom were received by a large delegation of prominent citizens of New York and other cities, and heartily welcomed to America. The delegation started early this morning and boarded the SCYTHIA on her way up. An address of welcome by the citizens of New York and another by the citizens of Chicago were presented.

The Situation in Main.

A Secret Military Organization—Fears for the State House Safety.

NEW YORK, Jan 2.—The HERALD's August special says that the State House is thoroughly guarded, and the utmost vigilance prevails, owing to a well-founded rumor that a secret military organization has been formed composed of ex-soldiers.

The Sun's August special says that the situation last night was less warlike than before for many days. It is reported that the Republicans will resort to parliamentary tactics to attain their objects, and that force will not be used.

1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from a post office, whether directed in his name or another's, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for payment.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued he must pay all arrears, or the publishers may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

3. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncollected for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.
