

Vaughan Council.

The Municipal Council of the Township of Vaughan met at the Town Hall, on Tuesday, the 5th day of March, 1880 at 10 a.m.

The Reeve in the chair. Members present: Messrs Card, Natress, Reaman and Lahmer.

The minutes of last meeting were read, and on motion adopted.

The following petitions were presented:

From John Lahmer and 30 others, asking a grant in the Vaughan Plowing Association.

From Geo. Wallace and 23 others, asking a grant of money to repair the road leading from Mr Smiths to Duncan McCullums, in the village of Woodbridge.

From J P Rupert and 11 others, asking aid for Francis Lyons, indigent.

From R B McNair and 14 others, asking aid for Andrew Bodell and wife indigents.

From Benjamin Musselman and 11 others asking aid for Elizabeth Brown, indigent.

A claim for sheep killed by dogs was presented from John Jeffrey, and laid over till next meeting.

A Communication was read from W A Wallis, J.P., in re Woodhouse.

Also from Blake, Kerr, and Boyd, in reference to the same.

Moved by Mr Reaman, seconded by Mr Card, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay to the Treasurer of the Vaughan Plowmen's Association a grant of \$25.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Lahmer, seconded by Mr Natress, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following persons the sums opposite their respective names, for charitable purposes:

Elizabeth Brown, to be paid to Mr Natress, \$5 00 in bulk; Geo. Henderson, to be paid to Mr Patterson, \$5 00, in bulk; Andrew Budell and wife, to be paid to Mr Lawrence, \$5 00 in bulk; Francis Lyon, to be paid to J P Rupert, \$5 00 in bulk; Dr McConnell, medical attendance on Mrs Keller, \$10 00; Alex Stevenson, board and lodging for D McCullum, \$6 75.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Reaman, seconded by Mr Card, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Wm Constable over charge in taxes, \$1.09. To A McMurethy on dog over charge, \$1. Also to Fullerton Gibson for dog wrongfully assessed in 1879, \$1.06.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Card, seconded by Mr Natress, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay to the Western Assurance Company the sum of \$12 00 for Insurance of the Town Hall, stable and shed from the 10th of March, 1880, to the 10th of March, 1883.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Card, seconded by Mr Reaman, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay the following road accounts, the same having been certified by the road commissioners in their respective districts: Dist No 1, Henry Rumble, 17 loads of gravel, \$1.70. No 2, Geo E. Liott, railing on bridge, \$10.00. No 3, Joseph Redman, lumber, \$2 11. Henry Peterman repairing culvert, \$1. 25.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Natress, seconded by Mr Lahmer, that By-law 390 be amended by striking out the name of John Allen and inserting the name of John Wilson, in lieu thereof, and that the corporation seal be attached thereto.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Reaman, seconded by Mr Lahmer, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay John Koves for twelve weeks board and lodging for Mrs Owens, at \$1 50 per week, up to the 9th of March, 1880, \$18 00.—Carried.

Moved by Mr Card, seconded by Mr Natress, that the Clerk be instructed to notify the commissioners of District No 2 to examine and repair road leading from Mr Smiths past Mr Matthews place, as they may deem necessary.—Carried.

The Treasurer presented the accounts of the Township for the year ending Dec, 31st '79.

Moved by Card, seconded by Mr Reaman that the report of the Auditors of the Treasurers accounts for '79 be received and adopted by this Council, and the Clerk is hereby instructed to have 500 copies printed in the usual manner, to be divided among the several councillors for distribution.—Carried.

The Council then adjourned till Tuesday 13th day of April next to meet at ten a.m.

Mr Collingwood, 6th con. Whitchurch, commenced ploughing on Friday.


Mr B Tomblinson, of this village, received twenty-four bushels of peanuts, this week, grown on his plantation down in Virginia.

AURORA MONTHLY SALES.—The first was at the Queen's Hotel, on Saturday, 11th of March. Some two or three hundred farmers and others, who have hitherto considered that such an established fact as a monthly sale was an impossibility, went away satisfied that it was practicable. The next sale will take place at Lemon's Hotel, on Tuesday, the 6th of April.

The employees of the Agricultural Works assembled in the Temperance Hall, on Thursday evening, the 5th inst, for the purpose of tendering Mr John A Smith with an oyster supper, previous to his departure from this place. Mr Smith left the position of foreman at a late hour, and all well pleased with the evening's pleasant reunion. Mr Smith carries with him the good wishes of all the workmen in this establishment.

LAW CONCERNING NEWSPAPERS

1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from a post office, whether directed in his name or another's, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for payment.

2. If a person orders his paper discontinued he must pay all arrears, or the publishers may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.

3. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the post office, or refusing and leaving them unopened, for 30 days is evidence of intentional fraud.
