Moved by Mr. Lahmer, see by Mr. Nattress, that the Council will not in future entertain any dog claims after the final revision of the Assessment Rolls, and will not refund the tax on any dog or dogs that may be entered on the Collector's Rolls.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Nattress, see by Mr. Lahmer, that the Clerk be instructed to advertise by handbills for tenders for building stone foundation under Town Hall, plastering, building chimneys, shingling roof, and building platform.—Carried.

Mr. Reaman moved, see by Mr. Lahmer, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay John Burr the sum of \$9.33 for two sheep killed by dog or dogs, being two-thirds their value.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Lahmer, see by Mr. Reaman, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay J. A. Stewart for printing and binding Voters' List for 1880, \$98, and advertising Clerk's notice \$2.

By-law No 402 was passed, appointing Chas. Nixon and Wm. Patterson collectors.

By-law No. 403, assessing the several School Sections in the Township was read a first and second time, and laid over until next meeting.

The Council then adjourned until Tuesday, 14th Sept to meet at 10 a.m.

From the Economist. BURGLARY.—On Sunday morning, 8th inst, the farm house of Mr. Nelson Harrington, Lot 26, 8th Con. Markham, was entered and all the drawers and trunks in the house broken into and ransacked.

Fortunately only \$4.50 were found and abstracted. The burglary was committed in broad daylight, the thieves gaining entrance by breaking a pane of glass in one of the windows and withdrawing the nail which fastened it.

LAW CONCERNING NEWSPAPERS

- 1. Any person who takes a paper regularly from a post office, whether directed in his name or another's, or whether he has subscribed or not, is responsible for payment.
2. If a person orders his paper discontinued he must pay all arrears, or the publishers may continue to send it until payment is made, and then collect the whole amount, whether the paper is taken from the office or not.
3. The courts have decided that refusing to take newspapers or periodicals from the post office, or removing and leaving them uncollected for, is prima facie evidence of intentional fraud.

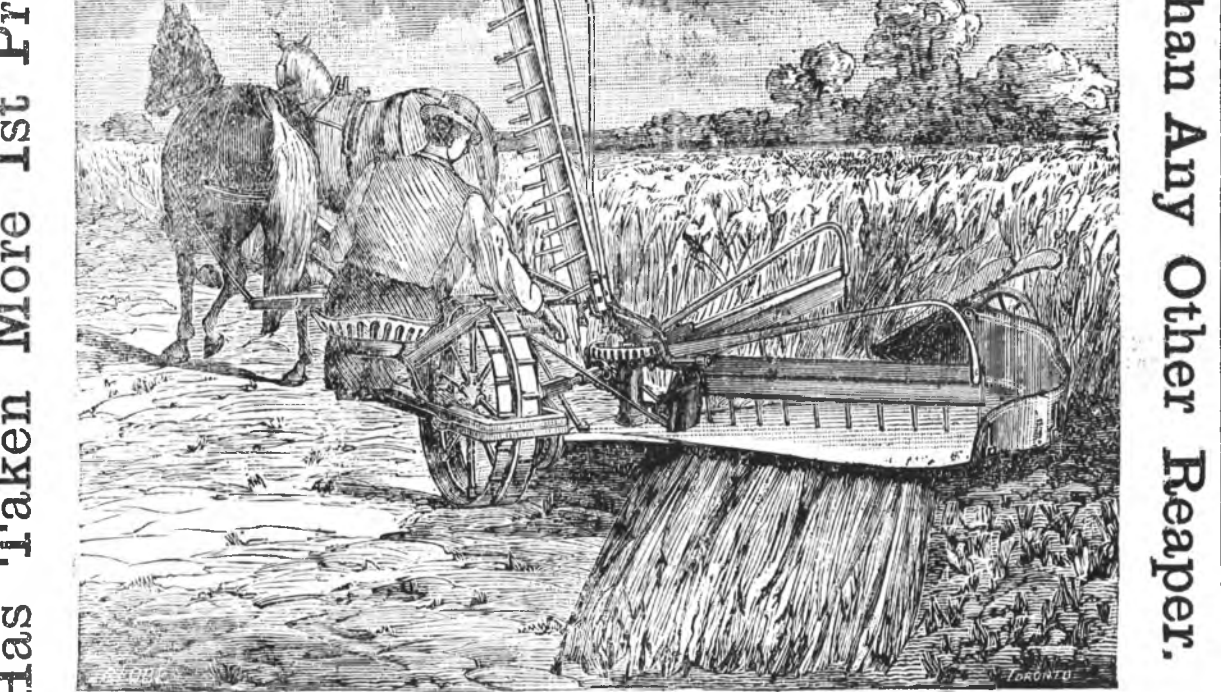
