CHURCH OPENING.—The building formerly known as the Congregational Church, Unionville, having been purchased and refitted, will be opened as a Presbyterian place of worship, on Sabbath, 29th inst.

FARMERS' CLUB.—The Farmers' Club will meet at the Franklin Hall, Markham, on Tuesday, the 31st inst., at 2 o'clock p.m. The subject for discussion, "Preparing the seed, and the best kinds of fall wheat to sow." Mr. A. Forster to lead in the discussion. The reports of such men as John Gibson, Esq., of Milliken, will do more to convince the British farmers of the actual wealth and agricultural resources of Canada than anything else. It is to be hoped that the attendance will be large.

BARN BURNED.—During the storm of Wednesday morning, the 11th inst., the barn belonging to Mr. John Bennett, Lot 6, Con D, Scarborough, was struck by lightning and burned to the ground, together with the contents—one wagon, nearly new, eight acres of fall wheat, 12 acres of barley, and 9 tons of hay. Loss, \$1,200; no insurance.

Miss Clara Foster, of Toronto, visiting at Mr. John Richardson's, Deputy-Rector of Scarborough, was killed by the G. T. R. Train on Tuesday, 10th inst. She was about 14 years of age, and was standing close to the track, waiting to see the cars go past, when her hat blew off, and fell on the track. She stooped forward to pick it up, and the engine struck her, and threw her about 50 feet. She was picked up dead. The body was only slightly scratched, but the skull was cracked.

The Ontario (official) Gazette of Saturday last, contains the Royal Proclamation raising the Municipality of Newmarket from a Village to the dignity of a Town. It is dated August 7th, and is to take effect on the 1st of December next.

NEW ORDER.—An energetic agent of the Ancient Order of United Workmen has been in the village for some days past, endeavoring to organize a lodge here. The order confers the benefit of a two thousand dollar life insurance on all its members. The fees for initiation are twelve dollars, and the history of the Order shows, for the fourteen years it has been in existence, that the average yearly assessment amounts to eight dollars per member. Each member pays in one dollar on the death of a brother, which is paid to the widow. The initiation fees provide for the working expenses of the Order, which are small. The system appears to be a good one, and the rate is little over one fourth the usual rates of life insurance.—Reformer

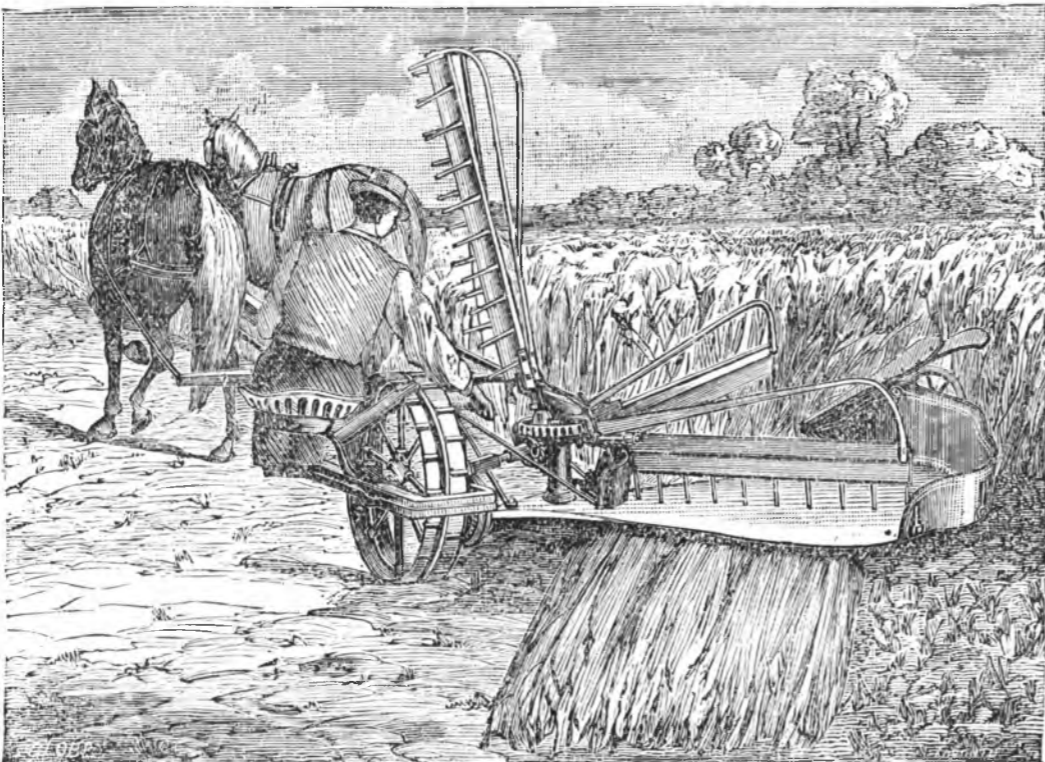
