LARGE YIELD.—James Humphrey, Esq., of Woburn, had sixteen acres of fall wheat which yielded, it is said, when threshed over thirty bushels per acre—a large yield for this season.

FAST WORK.—Some fast work was made harvesting at Mr John Pike's Maple Leaf Farm, 10th Con. Markham, last week. With a reaper, Mr Pike cut fifteen acres of oats in nine hours, and they were all bound in the same time by two men and two boys, Thomas Hague, Joseph Dotin, Perry Stevens and A K Pike. These oats are a new variety, peculiarly named Spotted Arabian. Mr Pike thinks the yield will be at least 70 bushels to the acre.

THE COBOCONK EXCURSION.—Between 1200 and 1300 persons availed themselves of the opportunity of visiting Cobocok on Tuesday. On arriving at Cobocok a grand rush was made for the two hotels for dinner, but as they could accommodate but a very small number, the many who were unfortunate enough to leave home without baskets were forced to buy cheap lunches at the stores, or go it a la Tammer. The steamer Cobocok took a number of excursionists to Laidlaw's Island, about five miles sail down the lake. As in nearly all cases where a large crowd is gathered, a great deal of rowdiness and drunkenness was to be seen. The last scene before leaving Cobocok was a fight something after the fashion of those conducted at Donnybrook fair, in which about twenty were engaged. No one was seriously hurt, however.
