Markham Township Council. Council met at White's Hall, Unionville, on Saturday, Feb. 26. Members all present excepting Mr. Reesor; the Reeve in the chair.

By Mr. James, from W. H. Lundy and 20 others, asking that a weekly grant be made to James Morrison, an aged man who resides near Buttonville, and who is in destitute circumstances.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Forster, moved, that a grant of \$3 per month be made to James Morrison, an aged and destitute person, said amount payable during the pleasure of this Council; Thomas Thomson, commissioner.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. Williamson, moved, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay Roger Hawkins, road overseer of Div. No. 59, the sum of \$3, being for lumber used for bridges and culverts in his division; payable to the order of the mover.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. Williamson, moved, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to retain the sum of \$23.50, as provided in chap. 32, sec. 267, U.S.O., entitled "An Act to provide for the registration of births, marriages and deaths."

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. Forster, moved, that the sum of \$14.28 be paid to the order of W. H. Ratcliff, for 1680 feet of 3-inch plank used for replanking bridge on side-line between lots 15 and 16, in the 5th concession, Road Div. No. 32.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. James, moved, that the grant for the support of Sarah Jane Dann be and is hereby rescinded, she having moved out of the municipality.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Forster, moved, that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to pay on the order of the Reeve the sum of \$20 to John Harmon, in compensation for injuries sustained by his wife travelling upon an unguarded embankment between lots 15 and 16, in the 7th con.

Mr. Williamson, seconded by Mr. James, moved, that the sum of \$1.50 per week be granted for the maintenance of Miss M. Brickwood, she being an indigent with two small children, said grant to be payable on order of the Reeve and to date from the first day of February, to continue during the pleasure of this Council.

On motion of Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Forster, the Council went into Committee of the Whole to audit the Treasurer's accounts for 1890, Mr. Williamson in the chair.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. James, moved, that the committee do now rise and report the accounts as finally audited, and that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to get 200 copies printed.
