

Markham Items.
Gleaned from the Economist.

A BANQUET.—A banquet was held at the residence of Mr. Henry Jennings, on Lot 26, Con. 6, of the Township of Markham, on Tuesday the 1st. March, in celebration of his seventieth birthday. There were present seven sons and three daughters—two sons and one daughter being absent. Five of the sons present were accompanied with their wives, and two of the daughters with their husbands. Mr. Jennings has forty-two grandchildren, seventeen of whom attended the feast, who with the addition of Mr. Frank Watson formed a company of about thirty-five, all of whom enjoyed themselves splendidly throughout the day.

PRESBYTERIAN SOIREE.—A jubilee celebration was held in the Presbyterian Church, Markham, on Tuesday evening, 15th inst, to commemorate the liquidation of a seven years' debt. The spread in the basement was attractive and appetizing and patronized to its utmost capacity. The Rev. Mr. Cartmel, chairman, was an efficient executive officer. The speakers, Rev. Messrs. Cockburn, Bart, Seymour, and Campbell, acquitted themselves with distinction as to wit, quaintness, point and unity. The proceeds were handsome, being \$107. In fact the whole proceedings were a success and demonstrated that "the year of jubilee has come" to the Presbyterian Church at Markham.

MAGISTRATES' COURT.—John Sinclair was arrested on a warrant issued by Jas. Robinson, J. P., and brought before Messrs. Robinson, Wales and Patterson, J. P.'s, on Friday 11th inst, charged with stealing grain, the property of D. W. Gemlo, from cars at the Nipissing station on March 2nd inst. Mrs. Arnsden, wife of the section boss, swore she had seen Sinclair carrying grain in a pail from cars at the station, and it was principally her evidence that convicted the thief. Sinclair was committed and sent to Toronto Gaol to await his trial. When Constable Marshall went to make the arrest Sinclair's wife told him that her husband was not at home and threatened to hit Marshall if he attempted to break into the house, but the constable found Sinclair hiding behind a bed and secured him.

STOCKS OPERATION.—R. C. Teft, Veterinary Surgeon of this place, performed the operation of extracting a stone, the size of a hen's egg, from the bladder of an animal belonging to Mr. Tool, on the 6th Con. Markham. The operation was one of great delicacy, and was successfully performed.
