

Fatal Accident.

SHOOTING OF WILLIE GOOCH, OF PARKDALE.

On Saturday Willie Gooch and his friend and schoolmate, Richard Cassels, went out to the lumber to spend the day shooting. About three o'clock in the afternoon, having got tired of the sport, they were returning along the Great Western Railway track. Near the Lumber River railway bridge is a small building used as a station, and here the lads intended to await the arrival of the suburban train to take them back to Parkdale.

The deceased was about 16 years of age, and had been attending Upper Canada College prior to the accident. He was son of Mr. R. N. Gooch, of the North British and Mercantile Insurance Company, and was very well known and a general favourite in Parkdale.

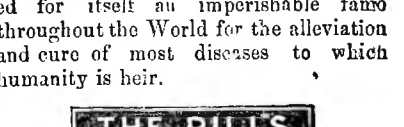
