A DISASTROUS FIRE.

(From our own Correspondent.)

Sometime between twelve and one o'clock on Saturday night, a fire broke out in Mr. Alfred Rupert's Store, and when discovered had made such headway, that all efforts to check it, were of no avail. The building, owned by Mr. Noble, was destroyed, with all its contents.

The fire caught the adjoining stables, rented by Mr. D. Watson from Mr. Noble and burned them to the ground. Mr. Watson saved his horses, but lost a ton of hay and a large quantity of bran. The wind blowing south, drove the flames to Mr. Adam Rupert's house, next door to the store. Part of the furniture was saved, but the house was consumed. Great difficulty was experienced in saving the life of Mrs. Rupert, she having become unconscious and almost suffocated by the smoke and heat. Mr. Rupert's stables and sheds were also burned.

The fire spread to Mr. Leeds Richardson's harness shop and house. Mr. Richardson saved his stock and furniture but the buildings were destroyed.

The various losses are given as follows:—Mr. Noble's buildings, \$1,000; insurance \$500. Stock in store, between two and three thousand dollars; insurance \$1,000. Mr. Adam Rupert's house, furniture, etc., \$1,600; insurance \$1,100. Mr. L. Richardson's shop, house, stock and furniture, \$1,200; insurance \$800.

The cause of the fire is unknown, but Mr. Rupert believes it to be the work of malicious persons. Those who arrived first at the scene of the fire, state that the door was open and the window raised. The loss is a heavy one for the village, as well as the persons concerned.

The Sutton Times says "On Saturday evening last the Hon. Mr. Norquay, Premier of Manitoba, arrived in Sutton, and remained over Sunday the guest of Mr. J. R. Stevenson, the Reeve. Mr. Speight boasts of certain machinery in his factory unknown to any other factory in the Dominion.
