Mr. Rupert's stables and sheds were also burned

The fire spread to Mr Leeds Rich ardson's harness shop and house, Mr. Richardson saved his stock and furniture but the buildings were destroyed.

The various losses are given as follows:—Mr. Noble's buildings, \$1,000; insurance \$500. Stock in store, between two and three thousand dollars; insurauce \$1,000. Mr. Adam Rupert's house, furniture, etc., \$1,600; insurance \$1,100. Mr. L. Richardson's shop, house, stock and furniture, \$1,200; insurance \$800.

The cause of the fire is unknown but Mr Rupert believes it to be the work of malicious persons. Those who arrived first at the scene of the fire, state that the door was open and the window raised. The loss is a heavy one for the village, as well as the persons concerned.


