Death of Dr. A. H. Hughes. Mail advices announce the death of Dr. A. H. Hughes, late of Toronto, at Bombay, on the 24th of April. The following additional particulars are taken from the Bombay GAZETTE of April 28th.

"Bombay on Monday, lost one of its most skilful surgeons and most popular citizens. Surgeon Major Arthur Henry Hughes died at 4 o'clock in the afternoon of pysmia or blood polsoning, which arose from a slight puncture on the hand while making an incision for the rollef of a patient a fortnight ago. On Friday last, Dr Hughes was about visiting his patie..ts as usual, and apparently in good health. A slight feeling of malaise he attr buted to fever, and he treated himself accordingly. On Saturday he was obliged to remain at home, but in the evening he thought he was nuch better. The next day the symptoms became so darming that Drs. Cook, Blanc, Dymock and Gray were called in. The patient stated that he was suffering from fever, now complicated by Ashma; but the four gentlemen just named all agree that the case was one of bl'od-poisoning, and that recovery was out of the question, and so it proved. Yesterday morning Dr Hughes made his will, and at four in the afternoon, he breathed his last. The decessed surgeon was born at Toronto, in Canada, and was quite a young man. He received his commission in the Indian Medical Department in October, 1809, and came to India in 1870. He was at first stationed up the country, in Kathiawar and other places, and rande a reputation as a clever surgeon by some difficult operations successfully performed. In 1874 he came to Bombay and was post-d to the Jeefeeboy Hospital, and was made P ofe-sor of Mitwifery in the Grant Medical College in succession to the late Dr Ward. He has held that Professorship ever since, and had acquired a very extensive practice in Bombay, his reputation making him much in request.
