THE EQUALIZATION OF ASSESSMENT.

The Councl resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the report of the committee on equalization of assessment, Mr. M Jones in the chair. The report provided for an increased rate of two dollars per acre in Scarboro and Etobiccke, one dollar per acre in Markham, & a decreased rate of one dollar per acre in King and East Gwillimbury. Mr Hastings, Deputy-Reeve of Yorkville, said lots on Davenport-road, was of the toll-gate, had been sold recently for \$10 per foot. Mr Stokes was of the opinion that the county of York was fairly assessed. There could always be found some lots assessed too low, but the committee had endeavoured to equalize the assessment. He could not see why York should be lowered, but it had been done and was now to be sassessed at \$35 per acre. Several members took part in the discussion, after which a vote was taken, when a motion to adopt the report was lost.

COUNTY PROPERTY.

The report of the Standing Committee on County Propert: was read, after which the Council resolved itself into a Committee of the Whole to consider the report, Mr Porter in the chair. The report was read clause by clause. The first clause recommended that the Commissioner of County Property should inquire into the security held by the county, indennifying them against liability of damages arising from accidents on sidewalks and approaches across ditches and crossings in the several municipalities through which the roads run. The secund clause recommended the releasing of Mr E Y Crown from the tenancy of toll-gate No. 2 on Yonge-street. The third clause instructed the Commissioner to enquire into the request of the Corporation of Yorkville respecting acquiring possession of a part of Yonge-street. The fifth clause relating to the Toronto and Western tranway Co., was objected to and the committee arose and asked leave to sit again.

The committee on equalization of assessment again reported, with Mr Speight in the chair. The report was adopted, yes 21, nays 11. The second report of this committee was presented. It provided that the assessment of Weston should be \$187,800 and that of Woodbridge \$106,000.

A report of the Commissioners on County property was considered in Committee of the Whole. Among other things the report stated that the authorities of Parkdale had repaired the Lake Shore-road, pursuant to order, and Wodsworth's bridge on the Humber had been repaired. It recommended the erection of a bridge on the Rearlet-road, a portion of the cost, at about \$2,500, to be paid by the County.


