

**Terrible Murder.**  
A MOTHER AND DAUGHTER STRAYED.  
**The Father & Son Chopped to Death.**  
A FRENCH CRIME.

Mr and Mrs Cook, of Little Rideau, near Montreal, and their son George, and daughter Emma, were murdered by a young fiend, named Mann, on Tuesday morning, Jan 2nd. The murderer has lived with the family for some months, as hired man. There are many motives assigned as the reason for the crime. Some reports say Mann first attacked Emma, in a store-house, adjoining the house, with the intention of outraging her, and being roused to fury by resistance, killed her. The struggle brought her mother to the spot, where she observed the fate of her daughter. Mann then attacked the father in the barn yard, and, taking him by surprise, killed him instantly by a blow with an axe. He entered the room where the son George was asleep, and bled him with the axe. Another son, Willie, was next attacked. He was seriously injured, but made a desperate struggle, and his sisters Maggie and Fannie, being weakened by the noise, ran to his assistance. Maggie seized the axe, and after a terrible fight, wrested it from the murderer. Both Fannie and Maggie were seriously wounded. The assassin escaped, but was arrested at Lachine, the next day, and taken to L'Original for trial.
