He entered the room where the son George was asleep, and brained him with the axe. Another son, Willie, was next attacked He was serious ly injured, but made a desperate struggle, and his sisters Maggie and Fannie, being awakened by the noise, ran to his assistance Maggie seized the axe, and after a terrible fight, wrested it from the murderer. Both Fannie and Maggie were seriously wound-The assassin escaped, but was arrested at Lachine, the next day, and taken to L'Original for trial.


