

EAST YORK.

The first meeting of the interests of Mr. John Bain, Liberal-Conservative candidate for the Legislature in the ensuing general elections, was held at the Wellington Hotel, Markham village, Monday afternoon. The meeting was well attended, and the enthusiasm manifested augurs well for Mr. Bain's success at the polls. The chair was occupied by Mr. John Gibson, president of the East York Conservative Association, who introduced the candidate with a few well-chosen words. Mr. Bain, in coming forward was greeted with loud applause. The speaker at once plunged into a hearty discussion of all the leading questions in provincial politics. He dealt with the Streams bill and the Boundary Award in a manner which showed his thorough familiarity with these subjects, and drew forth the unbounded plaudits of the audience. He referred to the Public Account and dealt scathingly with the presumption of a Government which plumed itself on a financial condition than which one more unsatisfactory could scarcely be found. The speech throughout was a masterly effort, and one which must have highly pleased his many warm supporters present. Mr. Bain is personally a most popular man, and the presence at yesterday's meeting of a goodly number of Reformers showed that a good many votes which had hitherto been cast for the Liberal, this time he polled for the Conservative candidate.

Newmarket.

INSPECTION OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT.—On Wednesday Messrs Savage and Elvidge, 1st and 2nd Engineers of the Newmarket Fire Brigade, made a thorough inspection of the fire protection apparatus. The official report will be presented at the next meeting of the Council. We are glad to learn that everything was found very satisfactory. Nos 1 and 2 Fire Engines were both in good working order. No 3 Engine needed some slight repairs and was left in proper shape. The hose appeared in good condition and was found properly reeled on both reels with the ropes in their proper places. The caretaker was highly commended for his careful attention and good keeping of the apparatus in every department. The fire engine is considered the entire equipment ready for any emergency. All the water tanks in town were also examined, and with two exceptions were found full to the top. These two tanks were about half full and both adjacent larger tanks, so that there is an abundant supply of water in case of necessity.

NOT TALK.—The report circulated around town on Tuesday morning that Mr. Rutherford, one of the buyers of the Market, was frozen to death while driving from Toronto to his home at Richmond Hill, the previous evening, is not true. One of our citizens saw him on Wednesday and he is alive and well.

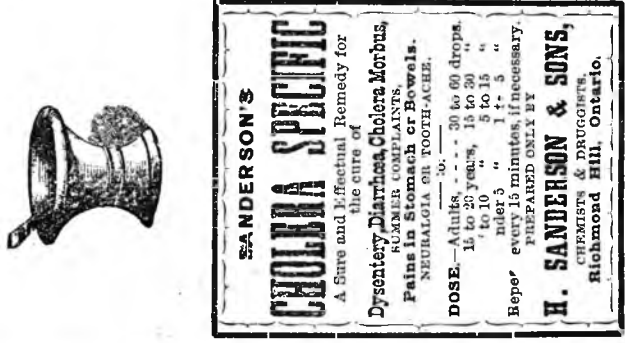

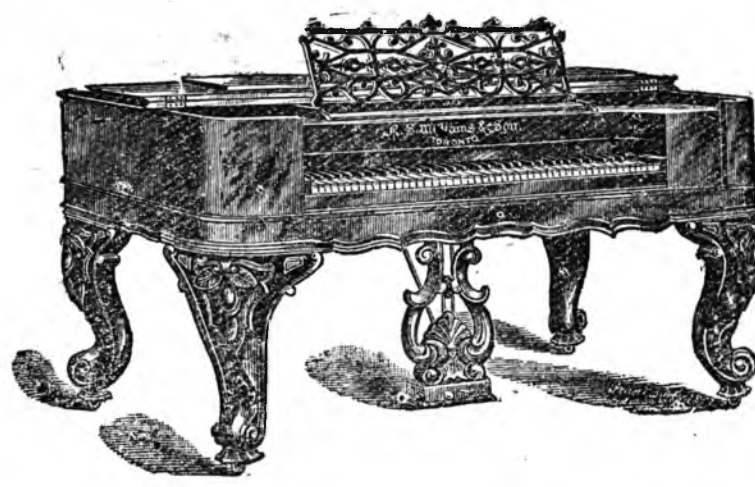

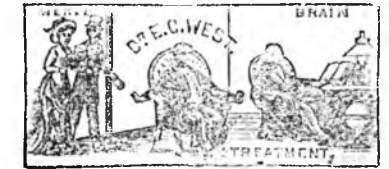
