

Markham Township Council.

The Markham Township Council met at Mrs. Page's hall, Unionville, on Saturday, 17th ult.

From J. W. Collins, Clerk of Whitechurch, relating to grant of \$500 on townline.

By Mr. Resor, from W. Tans and 18 others, asking compensation for losses sustained by Mrs. Finnie at the burning of T. Macdonald's barn in July last.

By Mr. Forster, from Mr. Reaman and five others, asking to be detached from Union School Section No. 22, Unionville, and attached to School Section No. 23 of this municipality.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Forster, moved that the Treasurer be and is hereby authorized to retain the sum of \$3240 for registration of births, marriages and deaths as provided by statute.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay Messrs Macdonald, DeWinton, and Ferguson \$1000 for services rendered in the case of Snider vs. this municipality.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Forster, moved that the auditor's report of the Township accounts for 1892, as finally audited by this Council, be accepted and passed, and that the Clerk be authorized to have 150 copies of said accounts printed and distributed.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay Jonathan Brillinger \$5, for three weeks after January 1st, and \$7 for the burial expenses of said child.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay J. D. Bowman, Inspector of Waterworks, \$100, for services rendered for the board, looking, and medical attendance for Wm and J. Carey, up to 18th January, 1893, also fares of the above Wilton, for the same period, on the market, amounting to the sum of \$101.15.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. James, moved, that the Treasurer refund each \$1 dog tax to Wm Boyd and Frances Pike, they having been wrongfully assessed in 1892, their dogs having died or were missing immediately after being assessed, as testified under oath.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. Resor, moved that the Treasurer pay James Riddle \$5, for keeping Robt. Anthony 4 weeks after Jan. 15, also \$5 for keeping said Anthony and Mrs. Whalen to House of Industry.

Mr. Resor, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay the following accounts for gravel, as certified by various road overseers, viz:—H. Leach, 307 yards at 10c per yard, \$30.70; D. Lynett, overseer, Robt Cox, 10 yards at 10c per yard, \$1; Wm Goin, overseer; Jacob Heiser, 55 yards at 10c per yard, \$5.50; Geo Baker, overseer.

Mr. Lundy, seconded by Mr. James, moved that the Treasurer pay \$5 Resor \$2, for burying a horse found dead on the highway, between Lots 10 and 11 in 8th Con.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. James, moved that the Treasurer pay Mrs. Page the sum of \$250, being for board and attendance on Mrs. Whalen, an indigent, for 1 week.

Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that \$10 be granted to gravel 10th Con, in Div No 74, (the ratepayers having gravelled a portion of said road by gratuitous labor, have asked the Council to assist them to finish the work) and that the Mr. Resor and the mover, be commissioners for the same, payable on order of the commissioners when work is completed.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Resor, moved that the Treasurer retain \$7 for horse hire, &c, to deliver ballot boxes for municipal elections for 1893.

Mr. James, seconded by Mr. Resor, moved that the Treasurer retain \$2.60, being expenses and mileage in taking seven indigent persons to the House of Industry and Refuge.

Mr. Eakin tendered his resignation as Reeve. Mr. Forster, seconded by Mr. Lundy, moved that the resignation tendered by Mr. Eakin as Reeve of this municipality be and is hereby accepted.

Mr. Resor asked leave to introduce a By-law for holding municipal elections in 1893. Leave given. On motion the By-law was read the several times and passed.

On motion the Council adjourned to meet on Saturday, 17th day of April next.

B., March 3rd.—The new Government was sworn in at Fredericton this morning as follows:—Blair, of York, Attorney-General and leader of the Government; Bider, of St. John, Provincial Secretary; Mitchell, of Charlotte, Surveyor General; Ritchie, Solicitor General; Gillespie, of Northumberland, President of Council; Vail, of Kings; Turner, of Albert; and Harrison, of the Legislative Council, members without office.

When the House of Assembly opened, the personnel of the new Cabinet was announced. The ex Premier stated that Mr. E. L. Wetmore had been chosen leader of the Opposition. The Legislature was prorogued until the 12th of April.
