**Farmers' Club Seed Show.**

The Farmers' Club seed show held at the Wellington Hotel, Markham, on Tuesday the 5th inst., was most successful—the number being only about 35 persons present—and 13 classes. M. Simpson, of Rensselaer, exhibited samples of 16 rows of barley, No. 1. 60 bushels at market price; 6 rows of barley, No. 2. 500 bushels, at market price; 2 rows of barley, 40 bushels, at 90 cents a bushel; Late Ross potatoes, 50 bushels at market price; Tartarian oats, 400 bushels, at 5 cents more than market price.

P. W. Baynton, Dufferin, exhibited Wild Goose spring wheat, 100 bushels, at \$1.00 a bushel.

Adam Hand, Milliken, showed White Russian spring wheat, has 200 bushels, at \$1.15; Black Tartarian oats, 1,000 bushels, at 50 cents a bushel.

John Tann, Belford, exhibited a sample of 6-rowed barley, has 350 bushels, at 75 cents a bushel.

Thos. Hood, Milliken, exhibited a sample of black barley, has 100 bushels, at \$1.00 per bushel.

Mr. Bruce sold 125 bushels Russian barley, Mr. A. Hood sold 100 bushels Tartarian oats, and Mr. Rennie sold a quantity of barley, oats and potatoes.

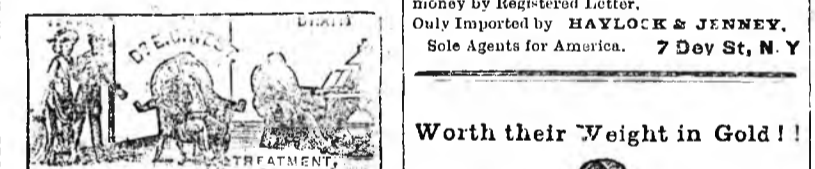
