

Vaughan Council:

The above Council met on the 13th Feb., ult. Reeve in the chair. Members present, Messrs. Cook, Webster, Reaman and Malloy.

Minutes of previous meeting read and approved.

A petition from J. Birkholder and 15 others asking aid for Vaughan Agricultural Society.

Mr. Reaman, seconded by Mr. Malloy, moved that the Treasurer be hereby authorized to pay to J. Brown the sum of \$3.00 for conveying eight persons to the Industrial Home, J. M. Lawrence, fare on cars to Newmarket of 7 J. Jodanis, \$3.00, and John McClure, County Constable, for services in 1882, \$3.00.—Carried.

Mr. Cook, seconded by Mr. Reaman, moved that the Treasurer be hereby authorized to refund \$1.00 dog tax to J. McDonald, he being erroneously assessed.—Carried.

Mr. Cook, seconded by Mr. Reaman moved that the Treasurer be hereby authorized to pay the following road accounts as certified by the several Road Commissioners—Dist. No. 2, to F. Topper for work and material, \$2.00; Dist. No. 3, Wm. Patterson, for stone, \$12.00.—Carried.

Mr. Webster, seconded by Mr. Malloy, moved that the Treasurer be hereby authorized to refund to the undermentioned parties the following sums, being assessed in the wrong sections, and that the Clerk assist the amount to the proper sections:—John Farrdale, \$1.71; John Kerr, \$5.30; Neil McGilivray, \$5.26.—Carried.

Mr. Malloy, seconded by Mr. Reaman, moved that the Clerk be instructed to get 60 bills offering for sale by tender the timber on the Road allowance running through lots 13, 14 & 15, rear of 6th Con., tenders to be received by the Council up to Monday 26th inst., at 2 p. m., at the Town Hall.—Carried.

Mr. Webster, seconded by Mr. Malloy, moved that the Council have a special meeting on Monday, 26th inst., to take into consideration the Hotel License and other business, to meet at 2 p. m.—Carried.

The following By-Laws were passed: By-Law No. 447 apportioning the interest accrued from the Clergy Reserve Fund to the several school sections.

By-Law No. 448, apportioning the interest accrued from the Municipal Loan Fund to the several school sections.

By-Law No. 449, appointing Auditors.

The Council then adjourned until Feb. 26th.

SPECIAL MEETING
A special meeting was held on Feb. 26th, at 2 p. m. Reeve in the chair. All the members present.

Mr. Geo. Cahill presented 4 petitions representing 142 names, asking to have the tavern licenses in the township reduced.

The Council thought the petition did not contain a sufficient number of signatures of ratepayers to warrant them in entertaining the same.

The Vaughan Council met on the 13th of March. Mr. Cook in the Chair. Members present, Messrs. Webster, Reaman, and Malloy.

Minutes of previous meetings read and approved.

A petition was presented from Geo. Elliott and 13 others asking the Council for a re-organization of S. S. No. 14.

A petition from J. Wilson, and 12 others asking to be set apart as a separate beat with the petition at Thornhill.

A petition from J. Shooter and 12 others requesting the Council to pay John Langstaff, back payment for support of Jane Espey, \$20.00.

Mr. Reaman, seconded by Mr. Malloy, moved that the Treasurer be authorized to pay John Langstaff for the support of Jane Espey, in 1881, \$20.00.—Carried.

Mr. Webster, seconded by Mr. Malloy, moved that the petition of J. Wilson, and 12 others asking to be formed into a road division for the purpose of laying down sidewalks between 30 & 31, in the first Con., be laid over until next meeting for further consideration.—Carried.

Mr. Reaman, seconded by Mr. Webster, moved that the Auditor's report of 1882 be received and adopted by the Council, and that the Clerk be hereby authorized to have copies of the report printed in the usual manner, to be divided among the several councillors for distribution.—Carried.

Mr. Malloy, seconded by Mr. Webster, moved that the petition of Geo. Elliott, and 13 others asking for re-organization of that portion of Union S. S. No. 14 in Township of Vaughan, and Union S. S. No. 1 in Woodbridge, be granted, and that the Clerk be hereby instructed to prepare a By-Law by the next meeting of Council to appoint a Referee.—Carried.

By-Law No. 450 appointing Road Commissioners for 1883 was passed.

The Council adjourned to April 10th, 1883.

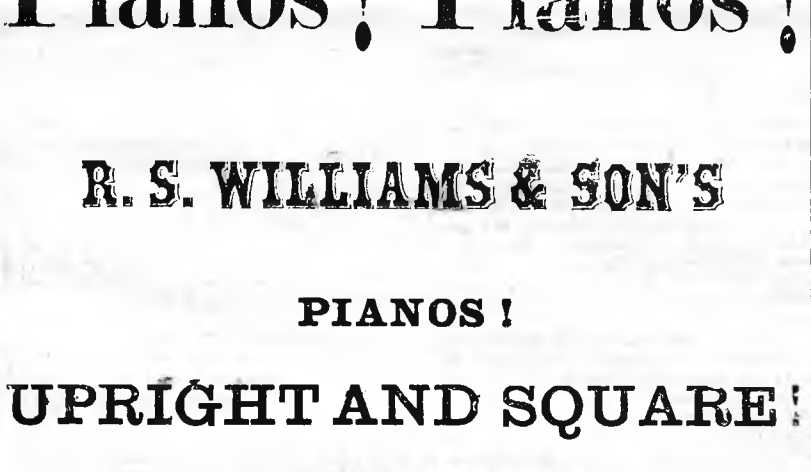
