THE HORSE MARKET. - Mr John Lumbrie shipped from Newmarket twelve horses to montreal on Tuesday. Besides those we made mention of last week Mr Thos Glove of North Gwillimbury received \$300 for a bay mare and Mr Charles Webb of Whitchurch \$350 for a span of greys. These twelve horses are said to be the finest lot ever bought by any buyer in this Town and they averaged \$175 each.

Another Importation .- It is now claim ed that Percheron horses are possessed of more endurance, are capable of performing a greater amount of quick, heavy work, are more tractable and easily broken than any other breed of horses. Mr Oliver Cuthbert son, of Queensville, purchased a Percheron horse from Mr Dunham, of Illinois State, 35 miles west of Chicago, who claims to the largest importing and breeding establishment in the world.
