

**Suicide at Willowdale.**

A farmer living in the vicinity of Willowdale, committed suicide on Thursday evening last by hanging himself in his barn. Deceased had gone to Toronto in the morning with a load of hay, and it was immediately on his return that he committed the rash act. It is known that he had been drinking rather freely, while in the city, and was probably intoxicated when he returned. He was found by his hired man, and immediately cut down, and Dr Langstaff summoned. Although he was to all appearance dead, the doctor succeeded in restoring him to consciousness, but he died early the following morning. Deceased was at one time well known in Toronto, as a Commission Merchant on Front Street, where he carried on business in partnership with Mr Brunskill, but his dissipated habits forced him to return to his farm. He leaves a wife and three children.

**The Dublin Hanging.**

DUBLIN, May 14.—Joe Brady, convicted of participation in the Phoenix Park murders, was hanged this morning at 8 o'clock. This is the first execution for the Phoenix Park murders. A vast concourse had gathered outside of the prison yard and a strong force of cavalry, infantry, and police were present. There was no attempt at a disturbance. The morning opened beautifully, but there were showers at about the time the execution took place. Brady submitted quietly while his arms were being pinioned, and walked slowly and unflinchingly to the scaffold.

The black flag, indicating that the execution had taken place, was hoisted over the prison at three minutes past eight. His body fell nine feet, and death was instantaneous. It is estimated that the crowd outside the gaol numbered 10,000. It is said that even greater than any of those which collected when executions were public. At the moment the black flag was seen over the gaol, the cry was raised "his off," and every head was at once uncovered. The crowd shortly after quieted down.

In the crime for which he has just paid the penalty of his life, Brady took a prominent part, being one of the men who did the stabbing. He is also accused of having been concerned in the attempt to murder Juror Field. Capable, if his talents had been turned in the right direction, of doing credit to himself and his country, he became through the influence of the infamous Carey, and others of like stamp, a willing tool to a murder which has brought disgrace and heart-breaking woe to his own family and checked the cause of Irish reform.

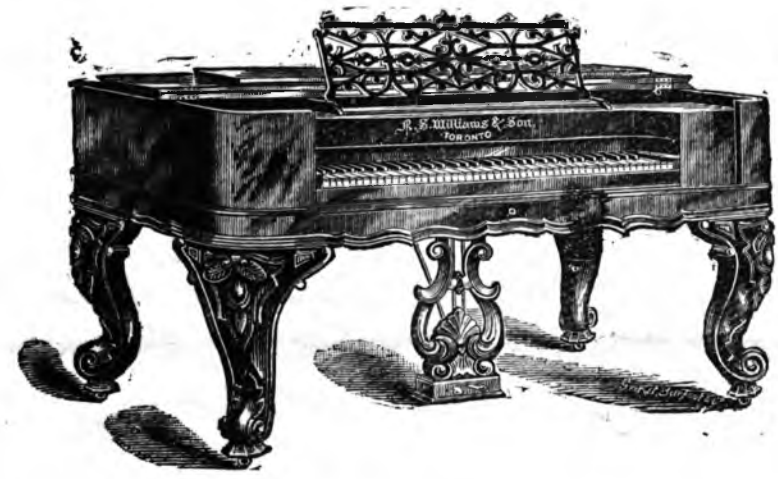
