H White, who in 1832 became resident of the locality then known as Potter's Field, subsequently Yorkville, and now St. Paul's Ward, in the seventy-ninth year of his age, passed peacefully to rest on Thursday evening last, attended by those who were near and dear to him. Mr White, from his first advent into the locality, became and continued a prominent man Possessed of energy, enterprize, and zeal, he took an active part in all that concerned Yorkville, wielding a considerable influence for good. At the beginning of his career the was a contractor and builder, efficient and thorough m all he undertook, and sur-passed by few. Possessing a good, clear, vigorous intellect, he was far seeing and able to form a good opinion of the outcome of what was transpiring around him, and thereby excelled in dealing in real estate, out of which he amassed considerable means He was twice married-first to Miss Mulholland, who died leaving one son and two daughters; his second wife was the oldest daughter of the late Mr Lardner Bostwick of this city, and died without issue. His son became a Provincial Land Surveyor, and died unmarried, during the American Civil War. His eldest daughter is the wife of Mr. A T Wood, Hamilton. His second daughter is a spinster, and resided with her father until his death, tending him with great care during his recent illness. Mr. White was a prominent and efficient mem-ber of the Bloor street Methodist Church of Canada, from its first inception, and at the time of his death held the position of a trustee and steward. In his official capacity he was competent, wise in counsel, conciliatory, a lover of peace and good will, a liber-al contributor, and interested himself in all that concerned the progress of the church. Mr White was the historian of Yorkville, having watched and been concerned in its development from a few small houses to its present importance. When any information was needed, as to the former owners of any part of Yorkville, he was always equal to the occasion. His kindly greeting and word of cheering counsel will be missed by many who esteemed him very highly.—




