York County Council.

The Council went into Committee of the whole, with Mr Richardson in the chair, to consider a resolution by Mr Hamilton, Reeve of Parkdale, to memorialize the Dominion Government with reference to the construction of subways at Parkdale and Brockton. In support of his resolution Mr Hamilton gave some interesting statistics regarding the passing of trains, people and vehicles at the crossing at Parkdale. During 26 consecutive days 70,000 people, and 14,000 vehicles had crossed the railway crossing. It had been found that during fifteen hour there was only an intermission of four minutes between the passage of trains at the crossing, and that a person passing over the crossings at any time during the day with a vehicle would be caught between the trains. Dr McConnell spoke in behalf of Brockton, on the necessity of constructing the subways.

A petition was read from the Sisters of St Joseph, House of Providence, setting forth the needs of the institution, and asking aid from the Council.

The memorial to the Dominion Government in reference to the subways in the vil lages of Parkdale and Brockton was adopt-The Reeve of Parkdale was author ized to sign it and forward it to Ottawa. On motion of Mr Hamilton, the warden was empowered to accompany a deputation

to Ottawa, Parkdale bearing the expense

The committee rose and reported and the report was adopted.

The Council went into Committee of the whole on the by-law providing rules and regulations for the Industrial Home, Mr

Jones in the chair. An amendment was passed to the effect that any person admitted to the Home being the possessor of money, the money shall be delivered over and placed to the credit of the Home; and persons admitted having a life interest in any real estate, such interest shall be utilized by the authorities of the Home. In case of personal property on the death of the inmate, it shall be handed over to relatives, or in case of there being none, retained by the Home.

The by-law was passed as a whole, and the committee rose and reported, the re-port being adopted by the Council. The by-law was read a third time and passed. The Council went into Committee of the whole on the by-law appointing officers of the Ladustrial Home, Mr Brodie in the

Dr Rutherford said he did not know that he had done wrong, and denied that he had been asked to meet the committee He had done his duty, and had never heard, save by report, that the by-law required that he should furnish medicine. During his term of office at the Home he had made 32 visits over 150 examinations, and had given 100 prescriptions, so that it would be seen he had given pretty good service for his salary. He would never have undertaken the dutie if it was understood that he was to furnish medicine. He read a letter which he had received from the committee, stating that

he would be required to do so, and this was the first intimation he had received.

Mr Rowen said that he had been informed by the keeper and inspector of the Home that the man Bentley, wh died, had never been prescribed for or taken a drop of neddicine. He disclaimed the responsibility of making any charge against Dr Rutherford before the Council, and the men who were championing Dr Rutherford's cause were those who wanted to kill him. He (the speaker) thought that what the doctor had said corroborated the statements made by the committee. He had never said that Dr Rutherford was responsible for the man's death. The fact was that the man had got drunk and had been picked up in the street in that condition, and having contracted a cold from the exposure, it contributed to his death

Dr Rutherford verbally tendered his resignation as physician of the Home. He then withdrew.

The consideration of the hy-law was proceeded with, and the name of Stanley Scott, M. D., inserted as physician of the Home. The by-law fixed the salary at \$100 per annum. Including the supply of medicine.

The committee rose and reported. In Council the report was read a third time and passed

The officers of the Home are as follows with the salaries attached — J D Phillips, inspector, \$50 ; James Irwin, keeper \$500; Elizs Jane Irwin matron, \$150 ; Stanley Ecett, M. D., physician, \$100.

The closing sitting of the June session of the County Council took place on Saturday morning. The report of the special committee appointed to consider the New Count House scheme, was read, the Council going into Committee of the Whole for its consideration, Mr Stevenson in the chair. The report stated that the Committee of the City Council appointed to confer with them could only receive propositions from the county. Since the present session began, however, the city committee had not received the sanction of the City Council, and the county committee had had no time to consider the proposition it contained. Time was asked for its mature consideration, and more particularly because of the somewhat novel nature of the proposition made. The committee had conferred with representatives of the city corporation relative to the claims of the country, arising ont of Yorkville's annexation to the city. An arrangement had been made by them that so soon as the city adopted a by-law assuming that portion of the York roads within Yorkville is should be transferred to the city. But the by-law had not yet been passed, and in case the city refused to fulfil the arrangement the country arising ont of Yorkville's annexation to the city to abide by the statute governing the matter. 
