

Markham Township Council.

The above Council met at Smith's hall, Unionville, on the 30th ult. The members were all present. The Reeve in the chair. The minutes of last meeting were read and confirmed.

From H. Beaton, clerk of the township of Pickering, stating that Pickering Council had made a grant of \$100 to grade and gravel terminal opposite 6th and 7th Cons. on condition that Markham grant a similar amount. The Reeve and John Barkey commissioners on behalf of Pickering.

From J. W. Collins, clerk of the township of Whitechurch, relative to grant made by Whitechurch Council of \$100 to improve the townline between Whitechurch and Markham on condition that Markham grant a similar amount for same. The Reeve and Deputy Brade commissioners.

PETITIONS PRESENTED.

By Mr James from B Jenkins and 10 others, asking a grant to grade and gravel road between Lots 25 and 26 in 5th Con., as road is in bad condition.

By Mr James from T. Helmkey an 11 others, asking a grant of \$30 to sink and enlarge ditch in front of lots 17 and 18 in 2nd Con.

Mr Forster asked leave to introduce a by-law to amend By-law No 262. Leave given, and by-law read a first time. On motion the by-law was read a second time, and the Council went into Committee of the whole thereon, Mr Reesor in the chair. The Committee rose and reported the By-law as amended with the blank filled with the name of W H Fry, poundkeeper in div. No 5, in place of J Grove, resigned. On motion the report was adopted, and By-law read a third time and passed.

Mr Reesor asked leave to introduce a By-law to amend By-law No 262. Leave given and By-law read a first time. On motion the by-law was read a second time, and the Council went into Committee of the whole thereon, Mr Lundy in the chair. The Committee rose and reported the By-law as amended by filling the blank with the name of Wm Miliken as road overseer of road div. No 36 in lieu of R Armstrong, who declined to accept the appointment. On motion the report was received and adopted, and the By-law read a third time and passed.

Mr Forster seconded by Mr Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay T Dubson \$5.33, being two-thirds value of two lambs killed by a dog or dogs, the owner of which is unknown.

Mr Forster seconded by Mr Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay Chas. Ackney \$3 for taking off a dog and putting on new plank on bridge on 6 h Con. at Unionville.

Lundy, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Reeve and mover be com. to build two culverts, one on sidewalk between lots 30 and 31, the other opposite lot 24, both in 4th Con.

Reesor, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Reeve pay the Street Mfg. Co. \$12.85 for 856 feet of plank used for culverts in div. No 54; also C. Webb 50 cents for cedar and spikes for the same place.

Reesor, seconded by Forster, moved that the Treasurer pay D Brazil \$10.75 for 768 feet of plank furnished Geo Robb, overseer of division No 52.

James, seconded by Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay C Harris \$14 for repairing road in front of Lot 1 in 3rd Con.

Forster, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Treasurer pay J. Pease \$5, for drawing plank for bridge opposite Lot 13, Con 6.

James, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Treasurer pay G Wilkinson & Co \$18, for two drag scrapers.

Forster, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Treasurer pay A Pinnock \$12 for filling washout and grading at corner of Lot 10, Con 6, payable on order of mover when the work is completed.

Forster, seconded by Reesor, moved that S Ramer and the mover be appointed commissioners to repair a bridge on sidewalk between Lots 15 and 16, Con. 8, and that the amount required for same be payable on order of mover when the work is completed.

James, seconded by Forster, moved that the Treasurer pay J. McDonald \$6, being half of amount for road plane for Markham and York townline as certified by road overseer.

Forster, seconded by Lundy, moved that the Treasurer pay I. Hoos Pearson \$15, for putting in culvert between lots 30 and 31 in 4th Con., payable on order of the Reeve.

Reesor, seconded by James, moved that W. Pitkey and the mover be commissioners to build a culvert opposite lot 3 in 10th Con.

Forster, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Treas. pay J. Crosson \$6.25, for five days hauling stone in division No 65, payable on order of Jas. McConchie.

James, seconded by Forster, moved that the Treas be authorized to retain \$7 for horse hire and delivering of ballot boxes, &c in February last, also \$3 for horse hire in posting notices in school sections Nos. 22 and 23.

Forster, seconded by Lundy, moved that \$100 be granted to grade the north townline of Whitechurch having granted a like amount, and that the Reeve and mover be commissioners, said sum payable on their order when work is completed.

Reesor, seconded by Lundy, moved that \$100 be granted to gravel east townline between the 6th & 7th Cons. of Pickering, Pickering having granted a like amount, and that Mr Forster and the mover be the commissioners, said sum payable on their order when work is completed.

Lundy, seconded by Forster, moved that the Treasurer pay R. Stover \$6.75, for digging a ditch in front of Lot 34 in 3rd Con., said amount payable on order of the Reeve.

James, seconded by Reesor, moved that S Cummer and the mover be a committee to repair washout at the German Mills.

James, seconded by Lundy, moved that Messrs. W. Hood, S. Wilson and the mover be a committee to cut down hill on townline at the foot of 3rd Con if deemed advisable. The said committee to act in conjunction with a committee from York Township.

Forster, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Treas pay the following accounts, being two-thirds value of their sheep killed by dogs, owners unknown: Jonathan Brillinger, 11 killed \$33; S Burkholder, 2 killed \$10.80.

James, seconded by Reesor, moved that F Helmkey and the mover be a committee to repair roads in front of Lots 17 and 18 in the 2nd Con., if deemed advisable.

Reesor, seconded by James, moved that a sum not exceeding \$50 be granted to repair road opposite Lot 2, 5th con., and that W Lundy and John Webber be commissioners to expend the same, payable on their order when the work is completed.

Lundy, seconded by Reesor, moved that the Reeve and the mover be commissioners to grade the road between Lots 25 & 26 in 5th Con.; also to improve the road in front of Lot 25 in 6th Con., the grant payable on order of commissioners when the work is completed.

Forster, seconded by Lundy, moved that \$40 be granted to gravel 9th Con., division No 68, and that Mr Reesor and the mover be commissioners to expend the same, also to examine and repair, if considered necessary, culvert on sidewalk between Lots 25 and 26 in Con 8, also two ditches on 9th Con., opposite Lots 20 and 22, said amount payable on their order when the work is completed.

Lundy, seconded by Forster, moved that the Treasurer pay John Beagone \$4.75, being for hauling hill for the safety of the travelling public, opposite Lot 30, Con 1.

Reesor, seconded by Lundy, moved that when the Council adjourns, it stands adjourned until Saturday, 20th day of August, 1883, then to meet at 10 o'clock in a. m. at the Council chamber.


