**BY-LAW NO 99**

To provide for draining certain parts of the Village of Richmond Hill, for the purpose of better preserving the health of the inhabitants residing in such parts, and for the necessary rates for the payment of the expenses attending the construction of said drainage.

Provisionally adopted the sixteenth day of July, A. D. 1883.

WHEREAS a majority in number of the owners, as shown by the last revised assessment roll, of the property hereinafter set forth to be benefited by the drainage now proposed, and the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, praying that in the interest of the sanitary condition of the Village, and for the prevention of Typhoid and Malarial Fevers and other diseases, you would pass a By-Law to levy a frontage tax sufficient to lay a box drain not less than ten inches square, in the ditches on each side of Yonge street, from the North boundary of A. Wright and Sons south to the stone culvert crossing Yonge street, opposite Dufferin street, and on the west side of Yonge street from Richmond street north to said culvert, and that the work be proceeded with as soon as possible.

And whereas, the Council of the Village of Richmond Hill, having received instructions from the Council of the County of York, to make a survey of and estimate of the cost of constructing certain drainage works in the Village of Richmond Hill, said works extending on the east side of Yonge street from the north side of Richmond street to the north side of a lane on the north side of Yonge street, and on the east side of a lane, thence south to the south side of Dufferin street, and a stone culvert crossing Yonge street to convey the drainage from the drain on the east side to the head of Dufferin street. I had to say that on the 15th day of the present month, I made a survey of the proposed works. I found the length of drain on the west side of street to be 1300 feet long, and that on the east side 892 feet, of that on the west side 438 feet was an 8 inch drain, while all the remainder of the drain was 12 inches diameter, excepting the piece crossing Yonge street being an additional length of 20 feet which should not be less than 15 inches. I think, however, the culvert crossing Yonge street, opposite Dufferin street, may, by a little deepening, be utilized as an outlet drain.

The cost of such works should not exceed, for straight drain \$75 per foot, if constructed of wood, and the gullies at the north end, if constructed of wood with iron grating, should not exceed \$8.00 each, the wood for gullies being cedar 6 inches thick. I therefore estimate the cost of the works at the above rates.

The expense of cost, I in my opinion, should be levied as follows:—For all those parts crossing streets, in the village at large; for all the remainder on the frontage opposite said drains, that is on the owners of said frontage in equal proportions per foot of frontage all being equally benefited.—For that piece crossing Yonge street (if any be used) in the proportion which the said side streets bear to the frontage being equally benefited at large, and the remainder on the frontage of the west side of Yonge street in proportions equal according to frontage.

As regards the owner of the lane on the north side of Mr. Wright's shop, his lane should be considered a part of the frontage and assessed accordingly, being as much benefited as others adjoining.

And whereas the said Council are of opinion that the drainage of the locality described is desirable.

Be it therefore enacted by the said Municipal Council of the said Village of Richmond Hill, in pursuance of the provisions of the "Consolidated Municipal Act, 1883":

1st.—That the said report, plans and estimates be adopted, and the said drain and the works connected therewith be made and constructed in accordance therewith.

2nd.—That for the purpose of paying the sum of \$15,000, being the amount charged against the said lands so to be benefited as aforesaid, other than roads belonging to the Municipality, the following special rates over and above all other rates shall be assessed and levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied) upon the undermentioned lots and parts of lots:

3rd.—And for the purpose of paying the sum of \$15,000 being the total amount assessed as aforesaid against the said roads of the said Municipality, a special rate of one hundredth part of a cent in the dollar shall, over and above all other rates levied (in the same manner and at the same time as taxes are levied) upon the whole rateable property in the said Village of Richmond Hill, after the date of the final passing of this By-Law.

Read a first, second and third time, and provisionally passed on the sixteenth day of July, A. D. 1883.

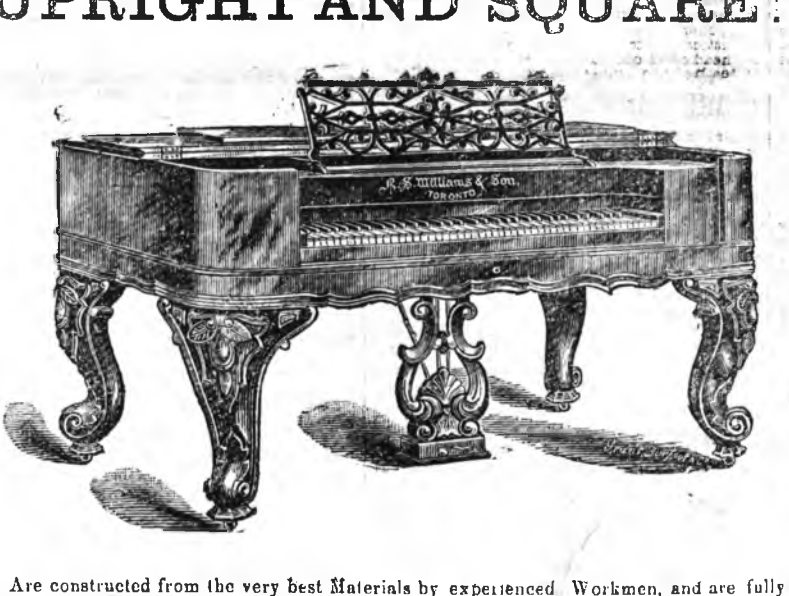
